An Act concerning the selling of agricultural produce, and amending R. S. 51:1-17.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. R. S. 51:1-17 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 51:1-17. All articles of food, other than liquids, which are capable
- 3 of being measured by dry capacity measure and which heretofore

33 "Dry capacity measure" means only bushel, half-bushel, peck, half-peck, quarter-peck, quart, pint, half-pint, and similar measures. 34 35 "Original standard container" means only barrels, boxes, baskets, 36 hampers or similar containers, the dimensions or capacity of 37 which is established by law of this State or by Act of Congress, [the contents of which have not been removed or repacked,] and 38 39 upon which is plainly and conspicuously marked the net quantity of 40 contents thereof in terms of weight, measure or numerical count. 41 "Bona fide farmers" means agriculturists or growers of fruits and vegetables who actually produce the commodities they sell and 42 **4**3 who are registered as such either with the State Department of 44

Agriculture or with any county agent or board of agriculture.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall,
for the first offense, be liable to a penalty of not less than \$50.00
nor more than \$100.00, for a second offense to a penalty of not less
than \$100.00 nor more than \$250.00, and for each subsequent offense
to a penalty of not less than \$250.00 nor more than \$500.00.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The present statute stipulates that when produce is offered for sale in standard containers instead of by weight, the container must be given to the purchaser. Some of the larger containers are expensive and add to the overhead of sellers of produce.

The intent of this bill is to allow sellers to place the contents of these containers in plastic or paper bags or any other suitable and less expensive receptacles.

R. S. 51:1-17 requires that when certain produce is offered for sale in standard containers instead of by weight, the container must be given to the buyer. As amended by the Assembly Agriculture and Environment Committee, Assembly Bill No. 2218 would amend R. S. 51:1-17 by allowing the transfer of such produce to a bag or other suitable receptacle when such transfer is agreeable to, and made in the presence of, the buyer.
