PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1976 SESSION

By Assemblyman JACKMAN

An Act to amend "An act to revise the law relating to payment of wages, repealing sundry sections of, and supplementing article 1 of chapter 11 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes," approved September 30, 1965 (P. L. 1965, c. 173).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. Section 4 of P. L. 1965, c. 173 (C. 34:11-4.4) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 4. No employer may withhold or divert any portion of an
- 4 employee's wages unless:
- 5 a. The employer is required or empowered to do so by New
- 6 Jersey or United States law; or
- 7 b. The amounts withheld or diverted are for:
- 8 (1) Contributions authorized either in writing by employees, or
- 9 under a collective bargaining agreement, to employee welfare,
- 10 insurance, hospitalization, medical [and/]or surgical or both,
- 11 pension, retirement, and profit-sharing plans.
- 12 (2) Contributions authorized either in writing by employees, or
- 13 under a collective bargaining agreement, for payment into company-
- 14 operated thrift plans; or security option or security purchase plans
- 15 to buy securities of the employing corporation, an affiliated corpora-
- 16 tion, or other corporations at market price or less, provided such
- 17 securities are listed on a stock exchange or are marketable over
- 18 the counter.
- 19 (3) Payments authorized by employees for payment into em-
- 20 ployee personal savings accounts, such as payments to a credit
- 21 union, saving fund society, savings and loan or building and loan
- 22 association; and payments to banks for Christmas, vacation, or
- 23 other savings funds; provided all such deductions are approved
- 24 by the employer.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

- (4) Payments for company products purchased in accordance 25 with a periodic payment schedule contained in the original purchase 26 agreement; payments for employer loans to employees; in accord-27 ance with a periodic payment schedule contained in the original 28 loan agreement; payments for safety equipment; payments for the 29 30 purchase of United States Government bonds; and payments to correct payroll errors; provided all such deductions are approved 31 by the employer. 32
- 33 (5) Contributions authorized by employees for organized and 34 generally recognized charities, provided the deductions for such 35 contributions are approved by the employer.
- 36 (6) Payments authorized by employees or their collective 37 bargaining agents for the rental of work clothing or uniforms or 38 for the laundering or dry cleaning of work clothing or uniforms; 39 provided the deductions for such payments are approved by the 40 employer.
- 41 [(6)] (7) Labor organization dues and initiation fees, and such 42 other labor organization charges permitted by law.
- [(7)] (8) Such other contributions, deductions and payments as the Commissioner of Labor and Industry may authorize by regulation as proper and in conformity with the intent and purpose of this act, if such deductions are approved by the employer.
- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill amends the law relating to the payment of wages to permit an employer to withhold from an employee's wages, payments authorized by an employee, and approved by the employer for a rental or cleaning service for work clothes or uniforms.
