# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

INTRODUCED MAY 27, 1976

By Assemblyman CODEY

Referred to Committee on Municipal Government

AN ACT to amend and supplement "An act for the establishment of a police and firemen's retirement system for the police and firemen of a municipality, county or political subdivision thereof," approved May 23, 1944 (P. L. 1944, c. 255).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1944, c. 255 (C. 43:16A-1) is amended to 2 read as follows:

3 1. As used in this act:

(1) "Retirement system" shall mean the Police and Firemen's 4  $\mathbf{5}$ Retirement System of New Jersey as defined in section 2 of this act.  $\mathbf{6}$ (2) "Policeman or fireman" shall mean any permanent and full-7 time active uniformed employee, and any active permanent and full-time employee who is a detective, lineman, fire alarm operator 8 or inspector of combustibles of any police or fire department. It 9 10shall also mean any permanent, active, and full-time officer employee of the State of New Jersey with police powers and 11 holding one of the following titles: motor vehicles officer, motor 12vehicles sergeant, motor vehicles lieutenant, motor vehicles captain, 13assistant chief, bureau of enforcement, and chief, bureau of enforce-14ment in the Division of Motor Vehicles, inspectors, and investiga-15 tors, in the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, conservation 16officer, assistant district conservation officer, district conservation 1718officer, and chief conservation officer, in the Division of Fish, Game, and Shell Fisheries, rangers, and chief ranger in the Bureau of 19Parks, marine patrolman, senior marine patrolman, principal 20marine patrolman, and chief, bureau of marine law enforcement, 2122correction officer, senior correction officer, correction officer 23sergeant, correction officer lieutenant, correction officer captain, and deputy keepers in the Division of Correction and Parole, 24medical security officer, assistant supervising medical security 25

26officer, and supervising medical security officer in the Department 27of Institutions and Agencies, county detective, lieutenant of county 28detectives, captain of county detectives, chief of county detectives, 29and county investigator in the office of the county prosecutors, 30sheriff's officer, sergeant sheriff's officer, lieutenant sheriff's officer, captain sheriff's officer, chief sheriff's officer, and sheriff's investi-3132gator in the office of the county sheriffs, county correction officer, 33county correction sergeant, county correction lieutenant, county 34correction captain, and county deputy warden in the several county jails, industrial trade instructor and identification officer in a 3536county of the first class having a population of more than 925,000 37inhabitants, cottage officer, head cottage officer, interstate escort officer, juvenile officer, head juvenile officer, assistant supervising 38 39juvenile officer, supervising juvenile officer, patrolman capitol 40police, patrolman institutions, sergeant patrolman institutions, and supervising patrolman institutions and patrolman or other police 41 42officer of the Board of Commissioners of the Palisades Interstate Park appointed pursuant to R. S. 32:14-21. 43

44 (3) "Member" shall mean any policeman or fireman included
45 in the membership of the retirement system as provided in section
46 3 of this act.

47 (4) "Board of trustees" or "board" shall mean the board pro-48 vided for in section 13 of this act.

49 (5) "Medical board" shall mean the board of physicians pro-50 vided for in section 13 of this act.

(6) "Employer" shall mean the State of New Jersey, the county,
municipality or political subdivision thereof which pays the particular policeman or fireman.

54 (7) "Service" shall mean service as a policeman or fireman paid55 for by an employer.

(8) "Creditable service" shall mean service rendered for whichcredit is allowed as provided under section 4 of this act.

58 (9) "Regular interest" shall mean interest as determined 59 annually by the State Treasurer after consultation with the 60 Directors of the Divisions of Investment and Pensions and the 61 actuary of the system. It shall bear a reasonable relationship to 62 the percentage rate of earnings on investments but shall not exceed 63 105% of such percentage rate.

64 (10) "Aggregate contributions" shall mean the sum of all the 65 amounts, deducted from the compensation of a member or con-66 tributed by him or on his behalf, standing to the credit of his in-67 dividual account in the annuity savings fund. 68 (11) "Annuity" shall mean payments for life derived from the69 aggregate contributions of a member.

(12) "Pension" shall mean payments for life derived fromcontributions by the employer.

(13) "Retirement allowance" shall mean the pension plus theannuity.

(14) "Earnable compensation" shall mean the full rate of the salary that would be payable to an employee if he worked the full normal working time for his position. In cases where salary includes maintenance, the retirement system shall fix the value of that part of the salary not paid in money which shall be considered under this act.

80 (15) "Average final compensation" shall mean the average annual salary upon which contributions are made for the 3 years 81 of creditable service immediately preceding his retirement or death, 8283 or it shall mean the average annual salary for which contributions are made during any 3 fiscal years of his or her membership pro-84 viding the largest possible benefit to the member or his beneficiary. 85(16) "Retirement" shall mean the termination of the member's 86 87 active service with a retirement allowance granted and paid under the provisions of this act. 88

89 (17) "Annuity reserve" shall mean the present value of all pay-90 ments to be made on account of any annuity or benefit in lieu of 91 any annuity computed upon the basis of such mortality tables 92 recommended by the actuary as shall be adopted by the board of 93 trustees, and regular interest.

94 (18) "Pension reserve" shall mean the present value of all pay-95 ments to be made on account of any pension or benefit in lieu of 96 any pension computed upon the basis of such mortality tables 97 recommended by the actuary as shall be adopted by the board of 98 trustees, and regular interest.

99 (19) "Actuarial equivalent" shall mean a benefit of equal value 100 when computed upon the basis of such mortality tables recom-101 mended by the actuary as shall be adopted by the board of trustees, 102 and regular interest.

103 (20) "Beneficiary" shall mean any person receiving a retire-104 ment allowance or other benefit as provided by this act.

105 (21) "Child" shall mean a deceased member's or retirant's 106 unmarried child either (a) under the age of 18 or (b) of any age 107 who, at the time of the member's or retirant's death, is disabled 108 because of mental retardation or physical incapacity, is unable to 109 do any substantial, gainful work because of the impairment and his 110 impairment has lasted or can be expected to last for a continuous

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111 period of not less than 12 months, as affirmed by the medical board. 112 (22) "Parent" shall mean the parent of a member who was 113 receiving at least one-half of his support from the member in the 114 12-month period immediately preceding the member's death or the 115 accident which was the direct cause of the member's death. The 116 dependency of such a parent will be considered terminated by 117 marriage of the parent subsequent to the death of the member.

118 (23) "Widower" shall mean the man to whom a member or 119 retirant was married at least 5 years before the date of her death 120 and to whom she continued to be married until the date of her 121 death and who was receiving at least one-half of his support from 122 the member or retirant in the 12-month period immediately preced-123 ing the member's or retirant's death or the accident which was the 124 direct cause of the member's death. The dependency of such a 125 widower will be considered terminated by marriage of the widower 126 subsequent to the death of the member or retirant. In the event of 127 the payment of an accidental death benefit, the 5-year qualification 128 shall be waived.

(24) "Widow" shall mean the woman to whom a member or retirant was married at least 5 years before the date of his death and to whom he continued to be married until the date of his death and who has not remarried. In the event of the payment of an accidental death benefit, the 5-year qualification shall be waived.

(25) "Fiscal year" shall mean any year commencing with July 1,135 and ending with June 30, next following.

136 (26) "Compensation" shall mean the base salary, for services 137 as a member as defined in this act, which is in accordance with 138 established salary policies of the member's employer for all em-139 ployees in the same position but shall not include individual salary 140 adjustments which are granted primarily in anticipation of the 141 member's retirement or additional remuneration for performing 142 temporary duties beyond the regular work day.

143 (27) "Department" shall mean any police or fire department of 144 a municipality or a fire department of a fire district located in a 145 township or a county police or park police department or the 146 appropriate department of the State or instrumentality thereof.

1 2. a. (New section) Any officer eligible to become a member pursuant to the amendatory provisions of this act who is enrolled in 2the Public Employees' Retirement System or the county pension  $\mathbf{3}$ fund created under P. L. 1943, c. 160 (C. 43:10-18.1 et seq.), shall 4 be permitted to transfer his membership from the aforementioned 5 system or fund to the Police and Firemen's Retirement System of 6 7 New Jersey in accordance with the provisions of P. L. 1973, c. 156 (C. 43:16A-62 et seq.). 8

9 Whenever in P. L. 1973, c. 156 a period of time is set which is to
10 be calculated from the effective date of said act, such time shall be
11 calculated from the effective date of this amendatory and supple12 mentary act for the purposes hereof.

13 b. Each new officer who begins employment following the effec-14 tive date of the amendatory and supplementary act, shall be required to enroll in the Police and Firemen's Retirement System 1516of New Jersey as a condition of employment, provided he is otherwise eligible for membership by meeting the appointment, age, and 17 health requirements prescribed of all members. As of the effective 18date of the amendatory and supplementary act, the eligibility for 19 membership of such new officers in the Public Employees' Retire-20ment System shall be terminated and membership requirements of 2122such other system will be deemed satisfied by enrollment of such employees in the Police and Firemen's Retirement System. 23

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

### STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to permit industrial trade instructors and identification officers employed by Essex County to become members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System. It provides that eligible officers may transfer their membership from the Public Employees' Retirement System or the Essex County Employees' Pension Fund to the Police and Firemen's Retirement System. The bill further provides that new appointees to the positions of industrial trade instructor and identification officer became members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System as a condition of employment.

# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

### DATED: NOVEMBER 23, 1976

Assembly Bill No. 1933 would permit industrial trade instructors and identification officers employed by Essex county to enroll in the Police and Firemen's Retirement System. The bill provides that such officers may transfer their membership from the Public Employees' Retirement System or from the Essex County Employees' Pension Fund to PFRS. The bill also provides that any new appointees to such positions shall be required to become members of PFRS as a condition of employment.

According to the persons requesting this bill, the bill would affect approximately 17 persons now holding the positions of industrial trade instructor or identification officer in Essex county. The positions of industrial trade instructor and identification officer are promotional by examination from the ranks of Essex county correction officers. Essex county correction officers are already members of PFRS. The problem, therefore, is that in taking the promotion to such position from the position of county correction officer such persons would lose their membership and would then be required to enroll in the Essex County Employees' Pension Fund or PERS at a significant loss of pension benefits.

The committee felt that this bill would address a significant oversight in the law, which should have been addressed at the time that Essex county correction officers were permitted to enroll in the Police and Firemen's Retirement System.

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed <u>A-1993</u>, sponsored by Assemblyman Richard Codey, (D-Essex) which permits industrial trade instructors and identification officers employed by certain counties to become members of the Police and Firemen's Retirement System.

To be eligible the industrial trade instructors and identification officers must be employed in county correctional facilities in counties of the first class having a population of more than 925,000.

The bill specifically applies to Essex County and will affect approximately 17 persons currently holding these positions there.

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
