Referred to Committee on Law, Public Safety and Defense

An Act relating to the consumption of specified alcoholic beverages in certain unlicensed premises and providing a penalty for violations thereof.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. No person owning or operating any restaurant, dining room
- 2 or other public place where food or liquid refreshments are sold
- 3 or served to the general public, and for which premises a license
- 4 or permit authorizing the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-
- 5 premises consumption has not been issued:
- 6 a. Shall permit or allow the consumption or alcoholic beverages,
- 7 other than wine or a malt alcoholic beverage, in a portion of the
- 8 premises which is open to the public; or
- 9 b. Shall charge any admission fee or cover, corkage or service
- 10 charge or advertise inside or outside of such premises that patrons
- 11 may bring and consume their own wine or malt alcoholic beverages
- 12 in a portion of the premises which is open to the public.

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STATEMENT

This bill would prohibit customers of restaurants, dining rooms or other food establishments open to the general public from bringing with them and consuming their own alcoholic beverages. The bill would not prohibit persons and organizations arranging for private parties in portions of unlicensed premises from making arrangements for provision of alcoholic beverages for those attending a private party.

This bill would prohibit unlicensed restaurants, dining rooms or other food establishments open to the general public from allowing their customers to bring with them and consume their own alcoholic beverages except for wine and malt liquor.

The Assembly Judiciary, Law, Public Safety and Defense Committee amendment was for the purpose of grammatical clarification.
