An Act concerning soil conservation, amending R. S. 4:24–18 and P. L. 1975, c. 251, s. 3, supplementing chapter 24 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, and repealing sections 4:24–7 through 4:24–17 and 4:24–35 through 4:24–38 of the Revised Statutes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. R. S. 4:24-18 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 4:24-18. The governing body of the district shall consist of
- 3 [three] five supervisors, appointed [as provided herein above]
- 4 by the State Soil Conservation Committee. The [three] five super-
- 5 visors shall be legal residents [and landowners] of the district.
- 6 At any time after 1 year following the organization of a district,
- 7 the supervisors of such district may recommend a change in the
- 8 number of supervisors from three to five or from five to three for
- 9 said district after holding a public hearing on the proposal to
- 10 change the number of supervisors and thereafter obtaining the
- 11 approval of the State Soil Conservation Committee for such
- 12 change. Any additional supervisors shall be appointed by the State13 Soil Conservation Committee in the same manner as hereinabove
- 14 provided for appointment of supervisors. Upon reduction in the
- 15 number of supervisors the committee shall designate the super-

- 9 b. "Certification" means (1) a written endorsement of a plan
- 10 for soil erosion and sediment control by the local Soil Conservation
- 11 District which indicates that the plan meets the standards promul-
- 12 gated by the State Soil Conservation Committee pursuant to this
- 13 act or (2) that the time allotted in section 7 of this act has expired
- 14 without action by the district.
- 15 c. "District" means a Soil Conservation District organized pur-
- 16 suant to *[R. S. 4:24-7 et seq.]* *chapter 24 of Title 4 of the
- 16A Revised Statutes.**
- d. "Disturbance" means any activity involving the clearing,
- 18 excavating, storing, grading, filling or transporting of soil or any
- 19 other activity which causes soil to be exposed to the danger of
- 20 erosion.
- e. "Erosion" means the detachment and movement of soil or
- 22 rock fragments by water, wind, ice and gravity.
- 23 f. "Plan" means a scheme which indicates land treatment
- 24 measures, including a schedule of the timing for their installation,
- 25 to minimize soil erosion and sedimentation.
- 26 g. "Project" means the disturbance of more than 5,000 square
- 27 feet of the surface area of land for the accommodation of construc-
- 28 tion for which the [Standard Building Code of the State of New
- 29 Jersey State Uniform Construction Code would require a [build-
- 30 ing construction permit, except that the construction of a single-
- 31 family dwelling unit shall not be deemed a "project" under this act

STATEMENT

This act provides equality of representation for all residents of a soil conservation district by removing the existing requirement that soil conservation district supervisors be landholders. It reaffirms the boundaries of each of the existing soil conservation districts and makes it clear that the whole area of the State is and shall remain within a soil conservation district. Other amendments alter the definitions contained in the "Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Act" to make them conform to those used in the "Municipal Land Use Law" and the "State Uniform Construction Code Act" and repeal certain redundant provisions of the statutory law.
