An Act to amend and supplement the New Jersey Higher Education Tuition Aid Act approved February 11, 1969 (P. L. 1968, c. 429).

Eligibility for tuition aid grants may be 37 extended to part-time students through regulations developed by 38 the Student Assistance Board and approved by the Board of Higher 39 Education if the level of appropriated funds allows such an exten-40 sion. No student shall be eligible for grants unless he maintains such minimum standards of academic performance as are required 41 42by the institution in which he is enrolled. No student shall be 43eligible for a tuition aid grant who is enrolled in a course leading to a degree in theology [,] or divinity [,] [or religious education]. 44 45 In the event a student for any reason ceases to continue to be 46 enrolled or otherwise becomes ineligible during the course of an 47 academic year, he shall cease to be eligible for tuition aid. Both the 48 student and the institution shall have the responsibility to notify the Student Assistance Board when a student ceases to be eligible 49 to receive student assistance because of withdrawal for any reason 50 or a change in status from a full to part-time student. 51 52

(b) Amount of grant. The amount of a tuition aid grant under this act to any student attending a public institution of higher 53 education in New Jersey for the 1978-79 academic year shall be a 55 minimum of \$100.00 and a maximum not to exceed the amount of tuition normally charged a student at the institution of attendance. 56 The maximum amount of a grant in subsequent academic years 57 58 shall be increased by the Student Assistance Board so that it equals 59 the tuition level in public institutions. For the academic year 1978-79 60 [The] the amount of tuition aid grant to any student attending a nontax supported institution of higher education in New Jersey 61 61A under this act for any semester shall not exceed the amount of tuition normally charged a student at the institution of attendance [less \$400.00] or \$1,000.00 whichever is less. The maximum tuition 63 aid grant to any one student in 1 academic year shall not exceed 6465 \$1,000.00. In subsequent years the maximum annual amount of a grant shall be increased by the Student Assistance Board in the 66 amount of the average tuition increase at the public 4-year institu-67 68 tions of higher education in New Jersey, but in no instance shall any grant exceed the cost of tuition at the institution of attendance. 69

70 The amount of a New Jersey Tuition Assistance grant under this 71 act to any student attending an institution of higher education in 72any state other than New Jersey pursuant to section 4 of he act 73 which this act amends and supplements shall not exceed \$500.00 in 74 an academic year. ### STATEMENT

This bill amends the "New Jersey Tuition Aid Act of 1968" by changing the eligibility requirements to enable students from public institutions and New Jersey students attending out of state institutions of higher education to participate in the program, with the objective of extending State tuition aid to eligible students in all New Jersey colleges. Previously, only students enrolled at nontax supported institutions of higher education in New Jersey were eligible for such grants. The bill provides for separate appropriations to fund the public, nonpublic, and out of state components of the program. The previous restrictive financial eligibility tables have been removed and the Student Assistance Board has been empowerd to establish financial eligibility requirements within the limits cited. This bill forms a major component of the coordinated State financial asistance program recommended by the State Board of Higher Education.

### Provisions:

This bill extends eligibility for Tuition Aid Grants to students at public institutions. It is the major component of the new, consolidated student aid program. This program was unanimously adopted by the State Board of Higher Education on June 17, 1977, with the support of all sectors of the higher education community.

#### PROBLEM ADDRESSED:

The new program is designed to addres two specific problems:

- 1. The only State financial aid available to needy students at public institutions, unless they are academically gifted or are educationally disadvantaged, is the PTAG grant included in the Appropriations Act to ease the impact of the FY 1976-7 tuition increase. These grants are a maximum of \$175.00. Aid is available at the independent institutions to a maximum of \$1,000.00. The TAG proposal would make students at the public institutions eligible for need-based financial aid to a maximum of tuition.
- 2. There is need to consolidate our aid programs. At present, there are six State programs plus Federal and institutional awards, with different applications, eligibility criteria, and different time schedules for announcing awards. TAG is a consolidated program with a common application form, common method of needs analysis, coordination with Federal Basic Grant Awards, and a single eligibility notice to the student.

### MAJOR ELEMENTS IN NEW TUITION AID GRANT PROPOSAL:

- 1. TAG is extended to include students at public institutions.
- 2. Minimum grant is \$100.00—maximum is \$1,000.00 or tuition whichever is less.
- 3. The award schedule is eliminated. The amount of grant will be determined by standards and procedures adopted by Student Assistance

Board and approved State Board of Higher Education.

- 4. If the annual appropriatin is insufficient, the Student Assistance Board will develop guidelines and procedures to distribute funds, with approval of Board of Higher Education.
- 5. TAG grants of up to \$500 could be used in states which have a reciprocity agreement with New Jersey.
- 6. EOF students will receive regular TAG awards and an EOF supplemental grant. A separate fund within TAG would be reserved for EOF.
- 7. All program elements—public TAG, independent TAG and out-of-state TAG would be appropriated by separate line items.

### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

6. Maximum \$1,000.00 or tuition

In addition to technical amendments, the Assembly Education Committee's amendments make the following substantive changes in the bill.

6. Maximum \$1,000.00 or tuition

### 1. Present scholarship holders:

Under the new program a number of students would lose assistance grants.

- a. Students who now receive Public Tuition Assistance Grant awards. These were established in the 1976 and 1977 Appropriations Acts to aid students affected by the increase in tuition at the public colleges.
- b. The change in eligibility criteria would eliminate some students now receiving Tuition Assistance Grant awards at the independent colleges.

The proposed new section 7 would save harmless these students.

- a. Public Tuition Aid Grants—3035 students—\$480,700.00.
- b. Tuition Aid Grants—uncertain—cost is estimated at approximately \$400,000.00.

- 2. Legislative oversight:
- a. Requires prior notification to the Joint Appropriations Committee in the event the awards must be pro rated.
- b. Extension of awards to part-time students would require approval by Joint Appropriations Committee's subcommittee on transfers.
- c. The Assembly Education Committee and Senate Education Committee would have the opportunity to review the guidelines prior to publication in the New Jersey Register.

### 3. Award Limitations:

- a. The committee felt it was appropriate to limit the total number of awards that can go out-of-State to 15% of the total.
- b. The legislation contained a provision that the maximum grant at the independent colleges would increase automatically if tuition were raised at the public institutions. In the judgment of the committee, the maximum grant should remain at \$1,000.00. Any increase should be reviewed by the Legislature as a separate public policy issue.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS:

The total cost of the consolidated program is estimated at \$5 million more than the fiscal 1977-78 appropriations. This would provide aid for 15,500 additional students.

In addition, the initial cost to save harmless 9,370 current scholarship holders is approximately \$3 million.

The Senate Education Committee unanimously supports the revision of the Tuition Aid Grant Program, and endorses the Assembly Education Committee's statement on this bill.

#### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

Apart from technical corrections, the amendments adopted by the Senate Education Committee deal with two basic issues:

### 1. Legislative oversight

The Assembly amendments provided that the standing reference committees on Education should receive prior notification of the standards and procedures to be used for the distribution of Tuition Aid Grant awards. In the opinion of the committee, a more comprehensive legislative review is necessary. Therefore, the bill is amended to provide for a 60-day legislative review and possible veto of these standards.

Given the time constraints of the first year of implementation this period of legislative review will be 30 days for the fiscal year 1978-79 and 60 days once the program is established.

A similar legislative review and veto provision will apply to the criteria to be used in the event that insufficient money is appropriated to fully fund the program. In this instance the chancellor will submit these criteria to the Legislature by March 1.

### 2. Portability

The Tuition Aid Grants may be used in other states which have a reciprocity agreement with New Jersey. As amended in the Assembly, the number of grants which could go out of state were limited to 15% of the total.

In the opinion of the Senate Education Committee, this limitation is too restrictive. The requirements of reciprocity with other states provides sufficient control; therefore, this 15% limitation has been deleted.

The Senate Revenue, Finance and Appropriations Committee finds the Assembly Education Committee statement on this bill to be an accurate and concise statement, and concurs in that statement except to explain Senate Revenue, Finance and Appropriations Committee amendments to the bill:

### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

These amendments address the section of the TAG bill that prescribe how tuition aid grants would be allocated if appropriations were insufficient to fully fund student entitlements.

As released by the Senate Education Committee, the board would decide which students' grants to cut in accordance with "such procedures and guidelines as it may find appropriate", with the two houses of the Legislature having the power to veto those procedures within 60 days. The bill gives the State Board no basic policy guidelines to follow in devising its rules.

These amendments alter this section in 2 ways:

- (1) It stipulates that in the event of an appropriations shortfall the legislative body most responsible for funding levels—the Joint Appropriations Committee, through its subcommittee on transfers—must approve the proposed procedures.
- (2) It sets the basic policy guidelines that grant awards generally would be reduced in the event of a shortfall—rather than lopping off certain categories in their entirety (e.g., county college students or moderate income students) while fully funding other categories.

These amendments restrict the grant of broad discretionary power that the original bill would have given the Department. Instead they express a clear legislaitve policy.

They also eliminate the rarely-used recourse of legislative veto of rules by concurrent resolution, and substitute for it the more certain legislative oversight through the Appropriations subcommittee on transfers.

Eligibility for tuition aid grants may be 36 37 extended to part-time students through regulations developed by the Student Assistance Board and approved by the Board of Higher 38 Education if the level of appropriated funds allows such an exten-39 sion\*, subject to prior approval by the Director of the Division of **4**0 Budget and Accounting and Joint Appropriation Committee's subcommittee on transfers or its successor\*. No student shall be eligible for grants unless he maintains such minimum standards of

academic performance as are required by the institution in which 43 he is enrolled. No student shall be eligible for a tuition aid grant 44 who is enrolled in a course leading to a degree in theology [,] or 44A divinity [,] [or religious education].

In the event a student for any reason ceases to continue to be enrolled or otherwise becomes ineligible during the course of an academic year, he shall cease to be eligible for tuition aid. Both the student and the institution shall have the responsibility to notify the Student Assistance Board when a student ceases to be eligible to receive student assistance because of withdrawal for any reason or a change in status from a full to part-time student.

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed two bills creating a new Tuition Aid Grant (TAG)

Program designed to simplify and coordinate student financial aid programs and extend

eligibility to some 15,000 new students, primarily in county colleges.

The bills, A-3410 and A-3412, were sponsored by Assemblyman Daniel F. Newman, (D-Ocean). "For the past year, higher education leaders from all sectors have worked cooperatively to produce the best system possible. Legislative amendments have further strengthened the program. This legislation will greatly enhance New Jersey's reputation as a national leader in financial assistance to students," the Governor said.

Mrs. Katherine Neuberger, Chairman of the Board of Higher Education, also complimented the forward-looking attitude of higher education leaders. "The new program signed into law today represents tremendous effort on the part of many dedicated professionals to provide an improved student assistance package for New Jersey students. The result reaffirms New Jersey's national leadership role in student assistance."

The TAG Program, is designed both to simplify the procedures for receiving State student aid and to provide higher levels of aid to a greater number of New Jersey students.

"Under the new system, several broad gains will be accomplished starting in 1978-79," said T. Edward Hollander, Chancellor of Higher Education. "First, there will be grant awards to more students, including county college students not presently receiving tuition assistance, and larger awards to many low and middle income students.

"Second, the TAG Program will provide tuition aid up to the full cost of tuition at a public college, up to \$1,000 at an independent college, and up to \$500 at colleges outside New Jersey, provided that state has a reciprocity agreement with New Jersey.

"Third, a common application form will be used which will allow students to apply simultaneously for financial aid from the federal and state governments and from the institution, reducing the handful of separate forms now in use.



"Fourth, eligibility for State tuition awards will be determined on a uniform basis throughout the State. The use of a common method of need analysis will insure that all students will be judged on the same criteria when applying for financial aid.

"Finally, the coordinated program structure will be easier to understand. One basic State grant (TAG) will serve as the foundation for all State student assistance. In addition to the TAG grant, additional grants will be available to students demonstration outstanding academic potential or educational and economic deprivation," Hollander said.

The Educational Opportunity Fund program (EOF) will remain as the State's main program for educationally and economically disadvantaged students. The State Guaranteed Student Loan Program will also be unchanged.

The existing New Jersey State Scholarships, however, will be replaced by a new campus-based program called Garden State Scholars. Under this program, institutions in New Jersey will receive State funds to select academically able students to be Garden State Scholars and award them a grant up to \$500. State Scholars will also be eligible for Tuition Aid Grants. Garden State Scholarships will be restricted to New Jersey institutions.

The New Jersey Financial Aid Form, presently available at high schools and colleges across the State, will serve as the application for the new program. This same application is also used to apply for federal and other student aid.

Students currently receiving State scholarships, tuition aid grants, public tuition aid grants, EOF grants, will continue to receive their present state assistance in 1978-79 unless the program rules provide higher levels of student assistance.

#### EXAMPLE SHEET

Here are some examples of how the new program would work under full funding:

- 1. John comes from a family with five children, an income of \$7,000 and assets of \$8,000. He is the first to attend college. It is estimated that his family will be unable to contribute toward college expenses. He wants to attend Burlington County College (tuition = \$500). His TAG grant would be \$500 (full tuition). In addition, he would be eligible for a federal Basic Grant of \$1,100, and might be selected by the college for an EOF grant of \$350.
- 2. Mark comes from a family with three children, an income of \$11,000 and assets of \$9,500. He has a brother already in college. The Uniform Methodology calculation results in an estimated family contribution of \$500. He wants to attend either Trenton State College (tuition = \$700) or Rider Collge (tuition \$2,750). His TAG grant would be \$450 at Trenton State or \$825 at Rider. He is also eligible for a federal Basic Grant of \$920.
- 3. Marsha comes from a family with three children, a \$17,000 income and \$23,000 in assets. She is the only child in college. Her family's estimated contribution toward college expenses is \$1,400. She plans to go to either Fairleigh Dickinson (tuition = \$2,560) or Montclair State College (tuition = \$700). Her TAG grant at FDU would equal \$530. She would not be eligible for TAG assistance at Montclair. She is not eligible for a federal Basic Grant. Because of her academic achievement, both colleges have offered her a Garden State Scholarship of \$500.
