An Act concerning mutual aid and assistance among municipalities for fire and police protection in certain instances, amending N. J. S. 40A:14-26, N. J. S. 40A:14-156 and P. L. 1976, c. 45, s. 4, and repealing N. J. S. 40A:14-66.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. N. J. S. 40A:14-26 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 40A:14-26. In the event of an emergency the chief or head of any
- 3 municipal fire department [or] and force, volunteer fire company,
- 4 municipal police department and force or park police department
- 5 and force, or first aid or ambulance squad, corps or company, or
- 6 the mayor or chief executive officer of any municipality may request
- 7 from the chief or the head of the fire department [or] and force
- 8 or volunteer fire company of any other [contiguous] municipality
- 9 assistance to protect life and property outside the normal terri-
- 10 torial jurisdiction of the department or company to which such
- 11 request is directed.

S. 40A:14-156, may be express order suspend operation of [an agreement entered into pursuant to this act as to that municipality] the provisions of any of said acts as to any municipality or municipalities in said county, upon declaration of an emergency pursuant to P. L. 1942, c. 251 (C. App. A:9-33 et
- 11 seq.), as amended and supplemented by P. L. 1953, c. 438, or any
- 12 regulation promulgated thereunder.
 - 1 4. N. J. S. 40A:14-66 is hereby repealed.
- 1 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill authorizes police and fire departments and certain volunteer bodies to call for emergency fire or police assistance from any other municipality. It also extends to any person rendering such assistance the same rights, immunities and authority as enjoyed by him in his own municipality, or enjoyed by their counterpart police or fire members in the municipality in which such assistance is rendered, as the case may be.

This bill continues the present statutory provision which, in the case of volunteer fire companies, requires a municipality to respond to any call for emergency fire or police assistance from a contiguous municipality.

In addition, this bill allows for local control in such emergency situations, unless the county disaster control coordinator determines and declares otherwise.

N. J. S. 40A:14-66 is repealed on the grounds that the provisions therein are similar to, and were intended to be superseded by, P. L. 1976, c. 45.
