AN ACT to amend the "Municipal Governing Body Vacancy Law,"
approved September 30, 1975 (P. L. 1975, c. 213).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 4 of P. L. 1975, c. 213 (C. 40:45B-4) is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 4. Nomination for a successor to a vacancy to be filled by election
4 shall be made **[**upon direct nomination by petition in the manner
5 provided by law for the filling of vacancies in municipal offices
6 where candidates are nominated by direct petition for a general
7 election**]** *in accordance with the provisions of Title 19 of the Re-*
8 *vised Statutes; except that in municipalities holding municipal*
9 *elections on the second Tuesday in May, nominations may be made*
10 *only by petition and neither the petition nor the ballot shall bear*
11 *any designation indicating the political party affiliation of the*
12 *candidate.*

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this amendment is to permit the nomination at a
primary election of candidates to fill a vacancy where nomination
at a primary election is otherwise permitted by statute.
