An Act concerning persons who are authorized to solemnize marriages, and amending R. S. 37:1-13.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. R. S. 37:1-13 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 37:1-13. Each judge of a Federal district court, judge of a county
- 3 court, judge of a county district court, [or] magistrate of a
- 4 municipal court, and any mayor, [including a] or chairman of any
- 5 township committee or village president of this State, and every
- 6 minister of every religion, and judges of the criminal judicial
- 7 district courts in counties wherein such courts are or may be
- 8 established, and judges of the juvenile and domestic relations courts
- 9 in counties in which such courts are or may be established, are
- 10 hereby authorized to solemnize marriage between such persons as
- 11 may lawfully enter into the matrimonial relation; and every
- 12 religious society, institution or organization in this State may join
- 13 together in marriage such persons as are members of such society,
- 14 institution or organization, or when one of such persons is a member
- 15 of such society, institution or organization, according to the rules
- 16 and customs of the society, institution or organization to which they
- 17 or either of them belong.
- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill would authorize a judge of a Federal district court to solemnize marriages.

DATED: MAY 20, 1976

Under this bill, a judge of any Federal district court in the United States could solemnize marriages in New Jersey. The immediate purpose for this bill is to enable the law clerk to a Federal district court judge in Philadelphia to be married by him in New Jersey, where relatives of the law clerk reside.
