Governor Brendan Byrne signed two bills into law today.

The first, A-751, sponsored by Assemblyman Walter Kozloski (D-Monmouth), entitles the New Jersey Horse Council to send delegates to the annual State Agricultural Convention.

Representation of the Horse Council was approved at the last Agricultural Convention by the present members of the State Board of Agriculture.

The second bill, S-871, sponsored by Senator Alfred Beadleston (R-Monmouth) extends the maritime lien law to include charges incurred for drydockage and storage of vessels on land or in the water.
