- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State

STATEMENT

Under the Judicial Retirement System Act of 1973 county court judges' pensions were increased from one-half to three-quarters of salary. The purpose of this bill is to enable any county court judge who by law was entitled to qualify for a full one-half County Court pension at the time the Judicial Retirement System Act was adopted in 1973, to continue to be eligible for a full County Court pension (three-quarters) under the 1973 act. In at least one case the technical effect of the 1973 act would be to discriminate unfairly against a judge previously able to qualify for a maximum County Court pension by preventing him from so qualifying under the 1973 act. This bill remedies this situation.
