AN Act permitting appointment of a chief warrant officer in certain counties of the first class and giving such officer full police officer status without having to take a civil service examination.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. In counties of the first class with a population in excess of
2 600,000 but less than 700,000, according to the 1970 Federal Census,
3 the sheriff may appoint a chief warrant officer to serve for a term
4 of 1 year without having to take a civil service examination. The
5 chief warrant officer shall have such full police officer status as
6 is granted to other sheriff's officers, and shall attain tenure upon
7 completion of the second consecutive appointment.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

This bill provides that the sheriff in certain counties may appoint one chief warrant officer without a civil service examination for a period of 1 year and said chief warrant officer shall have full police status and upon a second consecutive appointment shall attain tenure.
