AN ACT to amend the "State Uniform Construction Code Act",
approved October 7, 1975 (P. L. 1975, c. 217).

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 7 of P. L. 1975, c. 217 (C. 52:27D-125) is amended to
2 read as follows:

3 7. Code advisory board.

4 a. To assist and advise the commissioner in the administration
5 of this act there is hereby created in the Department of Community
6 Affairs a code advisory board to consist of **[13]** 15 citizens to be
7 appointed by the commissioner for a term of 4 years. The board
8 shall consist of: one architect registered in the State of New
9 Jersey; two professional engineers licensed by the State of New
10 Jersey, one of whom shall be a mechanical engineer and one of
11 whom shall be a structural engineer; one municipal building
12 official; one member of the building industry in the State of New
13 Jersey; one public health official in the State of New Jersey; one
14 licensed plumbing inspector in the State of New Jersey; one
15 licensed electrical inspector in the State of New Jersey; one fire
16 prevention inspector in the State of New Jersey and **[four]** six
17 members of the public, two of whom shall be experienced in repre-
18 senting consumers. Of the *13* members first appointed the commis-
19 sioner shall designate the appointees' terms so that **[three]** shall
20 be appointed for terms of 1 year, three for terms of 2 years, three
21 for terms of 3 years and four for terms of 4 years. Their suc-
22 cessors] **[to the greatest practicable extent the expiration of such**
23 **terms shall be distributed evenly over the first 4 years after**
24 **appointment. Thereafter, members of the code advisory board]***
25 *three shall be appointed for terms of 1 year, three for terms of

25A 2 years, three for terms of 3 years and four for terms of 4 years,
25B and that the two additional members first appointed by the com-
25C missioner pursuant to this amendatory act shall be appointed for
25D 2 years and 3 years respectively with such terms to be computed
25E from February 4, 1976. Thereafter, members of the code advisory
25F board* shall be appointed for terms of 4 years.

26 b. Code advisory board members shall serve without compensa-
27 tion but shall be entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred
28 in performance of their duties. Vacancies on the advisory board
29 shall be filled for the unexpired term. Members may be removed by
30 the commissioner for cause.

31 c. The code advisory board shall appoint a committee for each
32 subcode and, should a subcode therefor not be adopted, for sup-
33 plements to or revisions of the barrier free design provisions of
34 any model code adopted pursuant to section 5 of this act. Each
35 such committee shall consist of one member of the code advisory
36 board, who shall be chairman, and *at least* four citizens who are
37 experienced and knowledgeable in matters related to the particular
38 subcode. Each committee shall advise and assist the code advisory
39 board in the performance of its responsibilities under this act for
40 the subcode in question. Committee members shall serve without
41 compensation and at the pleasure of the code advisory board.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

This bill increases the number of public members on the code advisory board from four to six and accordingly increases the total membership from 13 to 15 members. Also permission is given for larger subcode committees.

The State Uniform Construction Code Advisory Board is a group of citizens, which includes professionals connected with the building trades and members of the general public, appointed by the Commissioner of Community Affairs to advise on the administration of the Uniform Construction Code. The larger advisory group is divided into subcommittees which serve in an advisory capacity for the various subcodes. This bill increases the number of public members on the advisory board from four to six so that the total membership would be 15 rather than 13. The bill also permits larger subcommittees to monitor the subcodes.

The Senate State Government, Federal and Interstate Relations and Veterans Affairs Committee amended the bill to provide that the two additional members first appointed by the commissioner pursuant to this amendatory act shall be appointed for 2 years and 3 years respectively with the terms to be computed from February 4, 1976.

Amend page 1, section 1, lines 22 through 24, omit in their entirety and insert "three shall be appointed for terms of 1 year, three for terms of 2 years, three for terms of 3 years and four for terms of 4 years, and that the two additional members first appointed by the commissioner pursuant to this amendatory act shall be appointed for 2 years and 3 years respectively with such terms to be computed from February 4, 1976. Thereafter, members of the code advisory board".
