An Acr to amend "An act concerning snowmobiles and providing for their registration and regulating the operation thereof," approved December 14, 1973 (P. L. 1973, c. 307).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. Section 3 of P. L. 1973, c. 307 (C, 39:3C-3) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 3. Except as otherwise provided, no snowmobile shall
- 4 be operated or permitted to be operated on or across

- 5 State unless registered by the owner thereof as provided by this

- All such registrations shall be [valid for a period of 1 year un-

STATEMENT

This bill provides for a common expiration date for snowmobile registrations. The effect of this legislation will be to reduce costs of administrative processing and costs of materials. Presently the Division of Motor Vehicles is required to issue a registration which shall expire 1 year from the date of issuance which means multiple expiration dates with multiple processing problems, resulting in inefficiency. The bill would increase the efficiency of processing snowmobile registrations.
