An Act to amend the title of "An act authorizing certain counties to provide for public transportation services and the operation thereof, and supplementing subtitle 2 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes," approved May 5, 1975 (P. L. 1975, c. 83), so that the same shall read "An act authorizing counties to provide for public transportation services and the operation thereof, and supplementing subtitle 2 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes," and to amend the body of said act.

- 1 1. The title of P. L. 1975, c. 83 is amended to read as follows:

Governor Brendan Byrne today signed the following bills into law:

S-864, sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont, Jr. (R-Warren), which authorizes the direct operation of public transportation services by all counties.

Under the termsof the bill, Sussex County will be able to receive \$117,000 from the Federal Highway Administration for a Rural Highway Transportation

Demonstration Project.

A-1447, sponsored by Assemblywoman Jane Burgio (R-Essex), which amends
Title 18A to permit a Board of Education to lease a tract of school property, which
is not currently necessary for school purposes but which the board does not want to
sell because it may be required for school purposes in the future, for a term
extending beyond the official life of the Board.

Although Boards of Education have the statutory authority to sell and lease real estate and property not needed or no longer suitable for school purposes, judicial and administrative decisions have held that a Board cannot bind subsequent boards by entering into a lease of more than one-year's denation.

Many school districts throughout the State are finding it necessary to discontinue the use of schools because of declining pupil population and are finding it difficult to lease the unused schools because of the one-year limitation.
