AN ACT subjecting municipalities solely owning or controlling waterworks or water supplies and supplying water in other municipalities to the jurisdiction, regulation and control of the Board of Public Utility Commissioners with respect to such service and supplementing Title 48 of the Revised Statutes, and repealing "An act concerning certain cities of the second class, and supplementing chapter 62 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes," approved June 18, 1947 (P. Whenever any municipality solely owning or controlling water-2 works or its own water supply is supplying *[or shall supply]* 3 water to the inhabitants of, or to other consumers of water within, 4 any other municipality, the supplying municipality shall with 5 respect to such service be subject to the jurisdiction, regulation and 6 control of the Board of Public Utility Commissioners in the same 7 manner and to the same extent as are the services of public utilities 8 and to that extent and for that purpose such supplying munici-9 pality shall be deemed to be a public utility.

1 2. "An act concerning certain cities of the second class, and 2 supplementing chapter 62 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes,"

3 approved June 18, 1947, is repealed.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

L. 1947, c. 295, C. 40:62–85.1).
- 1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Whenever any municipality solely owning or controlling waterworks or its own water supply is supplying or shall supply water $\mathbf{2}$ to the inhabitants of, or to other consumers of water within, any 3 other municipality, the supplying municipality shall with respect 4 to such service be subject to the jurisdiction, regulation and control $\mathbf{5}$ of the Board of Public Utility Commissioners in the same manner 6 and to the same extent as are the services of public utilities and to 7 that extent and for that purpose such supplying municipality shall 8 be deemed to be a public utility. 9

2. "An act concerning certain cities of the second class, and
supplementing chapter 62 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes,"
approved June 18, 1947, is repealed.

1 3. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to subject all municipalities owning waterworks and water supply systems, which supply other municipalities with water, to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utility Commissioners with respect to such service. P. L. 1947, e. 295, now imposes this control with respect to rates upon cities of second class only. The 1947 act is repealed by this bill and a supplement to the Public Utility Act is substituted in the interest of a more orderly arrangement of the statutes.
