- 6 which shall enforce and administer the provisions of this act.
- 7 (b) "Advisory committee" means the physical therapy advisory

- 9 [(b)] (c) "Physical therapy" or "physiotherapy" shall mean
- 10 and include [physiotherapy, electro-therapy or hydro-therapy]
- 11 treatment of a human being by the use of exercise, massage heat,
- 12 cold, water, radiant energy, electricity, or sound for the purpose
- 13 of correcting or alleviating any physical condition or preventing
- 14 the development of any physical disability; \*\*or the performance
- 15 of appropriate tests and measurements, authorized by the State
- 16 Board of Medical Examiners, to assess the extent of body mal-
- 17 function\*\* \*\* For the performance of neuro-muscular-skeletal tests
- 17A and measurements to determine the existence and extent of body
- 17B malfunction, \*\* provided, however, that physical therapy shall not
- 17c include radiology or electrosurgery.

- 22 (e) "Physical therapist assistant" shall mean a person who 23 assists, under the direction of a registered physical therapist, the 24 physical therapist in the practice of physical therapy and who per-25 forms such procedures delegated to him that are commensurate 26 with his education and training.

No person shall practice, nor hold himself out to be able to practice physical 15 therapy in this State, unless he is registered in accordance with the 16 provisions of this act. No person shall act, nor hold himself out as 17 18 being able to act as a physical therapist assistant unless he is 19 registered in accordance with the provisions of this act.
- 20 No physical therapist shall supervise more physical therapist assistants at any one time than in the opinion of the board can be 2122 adequately supervised. Under usual circumstances the maximum 23 number of physical therapist assistants that may be supervised by any physical therapist shall be two except that, upon application to 24 the board, the board may permit the supervision of a greater 25number of physical therapist assistants by a physical therapist if, 26 in the opinion of the board, there would be adequate supervision 27 28 and the public health and safety would be served.
