AN ACT concerning certain counties in relation to certain road
supervisors and supplementing chapter 14 of Title 27 of the
Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. The board of chosen freeholders of any county having a
2 population of ***[more than 500,000]*** *between 500,000 and 550,000,*
3 *according to the 1970 census,** may, by resolution, provide that
4 the county road supervisor of such county shall continue to be the
5 county road supervisor of such county during good behavior, and
6 that he shall not be removed as such county road supervisor except
7 for cause on notice and after a hearing before said board of chosen
8 freeholders; provided that said county road supervisor is a dis-
9 abled veteran who has continuously served as county road super-
10 visor of the respective county for a period of 3 years.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: APRIL 21, 1975

As amended, this bill authorizes counties having a population of between 500,000 and 550,000 according to the 1970 census to grant tenure to any county road supervisor who is a disabled veteran and who has served as county road supervisor for 3 years. The committee's amendment reflects its effort to ensure that the bill will affect only the situation in which it is needed.
