#### INTRODUCED JUNE 13, 1974

As amended by the committee this act would not take effect until 120 days following enactment in order to give parking boards or authorities time to comply with its provisions.

# FISCAL NOTE TO SENATE, No. 1257

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: NOVEMBER 25, 1974

Senate Bill No. 1257 requires all counties, municipalities and parking authorities created thereby to provide parking spaces for handicapped persons in parking facilities.

The Department of Community Affairs states that the cost to local governments to comply with the provisions of this legislation would be minimal and could be readily absorbed into the regular operating expenses. It is suggested that the prescribed parking lines could be painted when the lot is normally relined and the necessary signs could be made in the sign shops of the local governments.

The department states that a dollar value on the above would be less than \$1,000.00 per year per municipality. The majority of the expenditure would provide for the construction of curb ramps.

The fiscal note is based on an estimate of costs rather than actual cost information.

In compliance with written request received, there is hereby submitted a fiscal estimate for the above bill, pursuant to P. L. 1962, c. 27.
