This bill corrects an oversight in existing law by making it a misdemeanor to possess a forged, altered or counterfeited driver's license or motor vehicle registration certificate. The existing law covers only the act of forgery itself or the actual presentation of such false documents for identification purposes.

Under this bill, the forgery of such documents, the selling of a forged license or registration certificate, or the making, selling or possessing of printing plates for that purpose would become a high misdemeanor; while the mere possession or use of a false license or registration certificate would be a misdemeanor.

This bill, as amended in committee, would make the knowing possession of a falsely made, altered or counterfeited motor vehicle certificate of registration or driver's license with the intent to use the same unlawfully a disorderly persons offense.

The bill would also make the possession with the intent to distribute such documents, and the forging or sale of such documents a misdemeanor.
