An Act concerning city employees' retirement systems in certain cases, and amending P. L. 1964, c. 275.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. Section 4 of P. L. 1964, c. 275 (C. 43:13-22.53) is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 4. Retirement for age and service after age 60.
- 4 (a) Any member who shall have served in the employ of the
- 5 city for a total of 20 or more years and who shall have attained
- 6 the age of 60 years shall, upon his application to the commission
- 7 but not later than upon his attainment of age 65 be retired on a
- 8 pension equal to $\frac{1}{2}$ of his final salary, plus $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% of such
- 9 salary for each year of service in excess of 20 years, if the member
- 10 has more than 20 years of service at retirement. The benefit in-

STATEMENT

This amendatory bill is designed to permit members of the Employees Retirement System in certain cities of the first class (under 400,000 population according to the 1960 census) to continue employment from age 65 to 70 on an annual basis, regardless of service time, providing they:

- (1) Have the approval of their department head, and
- (2) Submit to a physical examination for determination of their fitness for continued employment.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY

DATED: SEPTEMBER 22, 1975

This bill permits a member of the municipal employees retirement system of Jersey City to continue in municipal employment and receive pension benefits for service after age 65, which is the current mandatory retirement age for all members of the retirement system.

This bill, as amended with the approval of the sponsor, allows any member of said retirement system to continue in municipal employment after attaining age 65, if the following conditions are met:

- 1. The employee's department director annually requests and the director of the Department of Personnel annually approves such extension; and
- 2. The employee annually submits to and satisfactorily completes a physical examination to determine fitness for continued employment.

For persons receiving such extensions, the mandatory retirement age is raised from 65 to 70 years of age.
