

# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### DATED: SEPTEMBER 19, 1974

The purpose of this bill is to permit the New Jersey Board of Higher Education to contract with the Dental School of Fairleigh Dickenson University for the acceptance of New Jersey residents into the dental education program.

For the past several years, the dental school's accreditation has been provisional with the stipulation that additional full-time faculty be hired.

The subsidy paid to the school via the provisions of this bill should enable the school to hire sufficient full-time faculty and avoid losing its accreditation as well as closing the school.

The school currently graduates approximately 50 students per year. If the school were forced to close, it would aggregate the current situation in terms of a shortage of dentists in the State.

A study by the Department of Higher Education indicates that the loss to New Jersey, in terms of new dentists practicing in the State that graduated from the school, would be 23 per year.
