The Assembly Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 1421.

As amended and reported by the committee, Assembly Bill No. 1421 revises the definition of "victim" under the "Crime Victim's Bill of Rights."

The amended bill changes the definition of "victim" to correspond with the definition of "victim" in the Victim's Rights Amendment under paragraph 22 of Article 1 of the New Jersey Constitution and to make the definition consistent with current law.

The definition of a victim in the Constitution includes the spouse, parent, legal guardian, grandparent, child, or sibling of the decedent in the case of a criminal homicide. The amended bill reflects this definition of "victim" and also revises it to include a domestic partner or civil union partner.

Under the amended bill, domestic partners and civil union partners would be entitled to protections under the Crime Victim's Bill of Rights and to receive compensation under the "Criminal Injuries Compensation Act of 1971," P.L.1971, c.317 (C.52:4B-1 et seq.). According to the sponsor's statement, the current practice of excluding domestic and civil union partners from these protections and benefits is unfair to the survivor and contrary to the intentions of the victim.

As reported by the committee, Assembly Bill No. 1421 is identical to Senate Bill No 180 (1R) which was also reported by the committee on this date.

This amended bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2016-2017 session pending technical review. As reported, the amended bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.
