1 AN ACT concerning driver testing and amending R.S.39:3-10.

3 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
4 of New Jersey:

6 1. R.S.39:3-10 is amended to read as follows:

7 39:3-10. No person shall drive a motor vehicle on a public
8 highway in this State unless the person is under supervision while
9 participating in a behind-the-wheel driving course pursuant to
10 section 6 of P.L.1977, c.25 (C.39:3-13.2a) or is in possession of a
11 validated permit, or a probationary or basic driver's license issued to
12 that person in accordance with this article.

13 No person under 18 years of age shall be issued a basic license to
14 drive motor vehicles, nor shall a person be issued a validated
15 permit, including a validated examination permit, until the applicant
16 has passed a satisfactory examination and other requirements as to
17 the applicant's ability as an operator. The examination shall include
18 a test of the applicant's vision, the applicant's ability to understand
19 traffic control devices, the applicant's knowledge of safe driving
20 practices, including the dangers of driving a vehicle in an
21 aggressive manner, which shall include, but not be limited to,
22 unexpectedly altering the speed of a vehicle, making improper or
23 erratic traffic lane changes, disregarding traffic control devices,
24 failing to yield the right of way, and following another vehicle too
25 closely, and of the effects that ingestion of alcohol or drugs has on a
26 person's ability to operate a motor vehicle, the applicant's
27 knowledge of such portions of the mechanism of motor vehicles as
28 is necessary to insure the safe operation of a vehicle of the kind or
29 kinds indicated by the applicant, and of the laws and ordinary
30 usages of the road. No person shall sit for an examination for any
31 permit without exhibiting photo identification deemed acceptable
32 by the commission, unless that person is a high school student
33 participating in a course of automobile driving education approved
34 by the State Department of Education and conducted in a public,
35 parochial, or private school of this State, pursuant to section 1 of
36 P.L.1950, c.127 (C.39:3-13.1). The commission may waive the
37 written law knowledge examination for any person 18 years of age
38 or older possessing a valid driver's license issued by any other state,
39 the District of Columbia, or the United States Territories of
40 American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, or the Virgin Islands. The
41 commission shall be required to provide that person with a booklet
42 that highlights those motor vehicle laws unique to New Jersey. A

1 road test shall be required for a probationary license and serve as a
2 demonstration of the applicant's ability to operate a vehicle of the
3 class designated. During the road test, an applicant may use a rear
4 visibility system, parking sensors, or other technology installed on
5 the motor vehicle that enables the applicant to view areas directly
6 behind the vehicle or alerts the applicant of obstacles while parking.

7 No person shall sit for a road test unless that person exhibits
8 photo identification deemed acceptable by the commission. A high
9 school student who has completed a course of behind-the-wheel
10 automobile driving education approved by the State Department of
11 Education and conducted in a public, parochial, or private school of
12 this State, who has been issued a special learner's permit pursuant to
13 section 1 of P.L.1950, c.127 (C.39:3-13.1) prior to January 1, 2003,
14 shall not be required to exhibit photo identification in order to sit
15 for a road test. The commission may waive the road test for any
16 person 18 years of age or older possessing a valid driver's license
17 issued by any other state, the District of Columbia, or the United
18 States Territories of American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, or the
19 Virgin Islands. The road test shall be given on public streets, where
20 practicable and feasible, but may be preceded by an off-street
21 screening process to assess basic skills. The commission shall
22 approve locations for the road test which pose no more than a
23 minimal risk of injury to the applicant, the examiner, and other
24 motorists. No new locations for the road test shall be approved
25 unless the test can be given on public streets.

26 A person who successfully completes a road test for a
27 motorcycle license or a motorcycle endorsement when operating a
28 motorcycle or motorized scooter with an engine displacement of
29 less than 231 cubic centimeters shall be issued a motorcycle license
30 or endorsement restricting the person's operation of such vehicles to
31 any motorcycle with an engine displacement of 500 cubic
32 centimeters or less. A person who successfully completes a road
33 test for a motorcycle license or motorcycle endorsement when
34 operating a motorcycle with an engine displacement of 231 or more
35 cubic centimeters shall be issued a motorcycle license or
36 endorsement without any restriction as to engine displacement.
37 Any person who successfully completes an approved motorcycle
38 safety education course established pursuant to the provisions of
39 section 1 of P.L.1991, c.452 (C.27:5F-36) shall be issued a
40 motorcycle license or endorsement without restriction as to engine
41 displacement.

42 The commission shall issue a basic driver's license to operate a
43 motor vehicle other than a motorcycle to a person over 18 years of
44 age who previously has not been licensed to drive a motor vehicle
45 in this State or another jurisdiction only if that person has: (1)
46 operated a passenger automobile in compliance with the
47 requirements of this title for not less than one year, not including
48 any period of suspension or postponement, from the date of

1 issuance of a probationary license pursuant to section 4 of
2 P.L.1950, c.127 (C.39:3-13.4); (2) not been assessed more than two
3 motor vehicle points; (3) not been convicted in the previous year for
4 a violation of R.S.39:4-50, section 2 of P.L.1981, c.512 (C.39:4-
5 50.4a), P.L.1992, c.189 (C.39:4-50.14), R.S.39:4-129, N.J.S.2C:11-
6 5, subsection c. of N.J.S.2C:12-1, or any other motor vehicle-
7 related violation the commission determines to be significant and
8 applicable pursuant to regulation; and (4) passed an examination of
9 the applicant's ability to operate a motor vehicle pursuant to this
10 section.

11 The commission shall expand the driver's license examination by
12 20%. The additional questions to be added shall consist solely of
13 questions developed in conjunction with the Department of Health
14 concerning the use of alcohol or drugs as related to highway safety.
15 The commission shall develop, in conjunction with the Department
16 of Health, supplements to the driver's manual which shall include
17 information necessary to answer any question on the driver's license
18 examination concerning alcohol or drugs as related to highway
19 safety.

20 Up to 20 questions may be added to the examination on subjects
21 to be determined by the commission that are of particular relevance
22 to youthful drivers, including the dangers of driving a vehicle in an
23 aggressive manner, which shall include, but not be limited to,
24 unexpectedly altering the speed of a vehicle, making improper or
25 erratic traffic lane changes, disregarding traffic control devices,
26 failing to yield the right of way, and following another vehicle too
27 closely, after consultation with the Director of the Division of
28 Highway Traffic Safety in the Department of Law and Public
29 Safety.

30 The commission shall expand the driver's license examination to
31 include a question asking whether the applicant is aware of the
32 provisions of the "Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act,"
33 P.L.2008, c.50 (C.26:6-77 et al.) and the procedure for indicating on
34 the driver's license the intention to make a donation of body organs
35 or tissues pursuant to P.L.1978, c.181 (C.39:3-12.2).

36 The commission shall expand the driver's license examination to
37 include a question asking whether the applicant is aware of the
38 dangers of failing to comply with this State's motor vehicle traffic
39 laws and the "STOP for Nikhil Safety Pledge" set forth in
40 subsection e. of R.S.39:3-41.

41 Any person applying for a driver's license to operate a motor
42 vehicle or motorized bicycle in this State shall surrender to the
43 commission any current driver's license issued to the applicant by
44 another state or jurisdiction upon the applicant's receipt of a driver's
45 license for this State. The commission shall refuse to issue a
46 driver's license if the applicant fails to comply with this provision.
47 An applicant for a permit or license who is less than 18 years of
48 age, and who holds a permit or license for a passenger automobile

1 issued by another state or country that is valid or has expired within
2 a time period designated by the commission, shall be subject to the
3 permit and license requirements and penalties applicable to State
4 permit and license applicants who are of the same age; except that if
5 the other state or country has permit or license standards
6 substantially similar to those of this State, the credentials of the
7 other state or country shall be acceptable.

8 The commission shall create classified licensing of drivers
9 covering the following classifications:

10 a. Motorcycles, except that for the purposes of this section,
11 motorcycle shall not include any three-wheeled motor vehicle
12 equipped with a single cab with glazing enclosing the occupant,
13 seats similar to those of a passenger vehicle or truck, seat belts and
14 automotive steering or any vehicle defined as a motorcycle pursuant
15 to R.S.39:1-1 having a motor with a maximum piston displacement
16 that is less than 50 cubic centimeters or a motor that is rated at no
17 more than 1.5 brake horsepower with a maximum speed of no more
18 than 35 miles per hour on a flat surface.

19 b. Omnibuses as classified by R.S.39:3-10.1 and school buses
20 classified under N.J.S.18A:39-1 et seq.

21 c. (Deleted by amendment, P.L.1999, c.28).

22 d. All motor vehicles not included in classifications a. and b. A
23 license issued pursuant to this classification d. shall be referred to
24 as the "basic driver's license."

25 Every applicant for a license under classification b. shall be a
26 holder of a basic driver's license. Any issuance of a license under
27 classification b. shall be by endorsement on the basic driver's
28 license.

29 A driver's license for motorcycles may be issued separately, but
30 if issued to the holder of a basic driver's license, it shall be by
31 endorsement on the basic driver's license. The holder of a basic
32 driver's license or a separately issued motorcycle license shall be
33 authorized to operate a motorcycle having a motor with a maximum
34 piston displacement that is less than 50 cubic centimeters or a motor
35 that is rated at no more than 1.5 brake horsepower with a maximum
36 speed no more than 35 miles per hour on a flat surface.

37 The commission, upon payment of the lawful fee and after it or a
38 person authorized by it has examined the applicant and is satisfied
39 of the applicant's ability as an operator, may, in its discretion, issue
40 a license to the applicant to drive a motor vehicle. The license shall
41 authorize him to drive any registered vehicle, of the kind or kinds
42 indicated, and shall expire, except as otherwise provided, on the last
43 day of the 48th calendar month following the calendar month in
44 which such license was issued.

45 The commission may, at its discretion and for good cause shown,
46 issue licenses which shall expire on a date fixed by it. If the
47 commission issues a license to a person who has demonstrated
48 authorization to be present in the United States for a period of time

1 shorter than the standard period of the license, the commission shall
2 fix the expiration date of the license at a date based on the period in
3 which the person is authorized to be present in the United States
4 under federal immigration laws. The commission may renew such a
5 license only if it is demonstrated that the person's continued
6 presence in the United States is authorized under federal law. The
7 fee for licenses with expiration dates fixed by the commission shall
8 be fixed by the commission in amounts proportionately less or
9 greater than the fee herein established.

10 The required fee for a license for the 48-month period shall be as
11 follows:

12 Motorcycle license or endorsement: \$18.

13 Omnibus or school bus endorsement: \$18.

14 Basic driver's license: \$18.

15 The commission shall waive the payment of fees for issuance of
16 omnibus endorsements whenever an applicant establishes to the
17 commission's satisfaction that said applicant will use the omnibus
18 endorsement exclusively for operating omnibuses owned by a
19 nonprofit organization duly incorporated under Title 15 or 16 of the
20 Revised Statutes or Title 15A of the New Jersey Statutes.

21 The commission shall issue licenses for the following license
22 period on and after the first day of the calendar month immediately
23 preceding the commencement of such period, such licenses to be
24 effective immediately.

25 All applications for renewals of licenses shall be made in a
26 manner prescribed by the commission and in accordance with
27 procedures established by it.

28 The commission in its discretion may refuse to grant a permit or
29 license to drive motor vehicles to a person who is, in its estimation,
30 not a proper person to be granted such a permit or license, but no
31 defect of the applicant shall debar the applicant from receiving a
32 permit or license unless it can be shown by tests approved by the
33 commission that the defect incapacitates the applicant from safely
34 operating a motor vehicle.

35 In addition to requiring an applicant for a driver's license to
36 submit satisfactory proof of identity and age, the commission also
37 shall require the applicant to provide, as a condition for obtaining a
38 permit and license, satisfactory proof that the applicant's presence
39 in the United States is authorized under federal law.

40 If the commission has reasonable cause to suspect that any
41 document presented by an applicant as proof of identity, age or
42 legal residency is altered, false or otherwise invalid, the
43 commission shall refuse to grant the permit or license until such
44 time as the document may be verified by the issuing agency to the
45 commission's satisfaction.

46 A person violating this section shall be subject to a fine not
47 exceeding \$500 or imprisonment in the county jail for not more
48 than 60 days, but if that person has never been licensed to drive in

1 this State or any other jurisdiction, the applicant shall be subject to
2 a fine of not less than \$200 and, in addition, the court shall issue an
3 order to the commission requiring the commission to refuse to issue
4 a license to operate a motor vehicle to the person for a period of not
5 less than 180 days. The penalties provided for by this paragraph
6 shall not be applicable in cases where failure to have actual
7 possession of the operator's license is due to an administrative or
8 technical error by the commission.

9 Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter or extend the
10 expiration of any license issued prior to the date this amendatory
11 and supplementary act becomes operative.

12 As used in this section:

13 “Parking sensors” means proximity sensors which use either
14 electromagnetic or ultrasonic technology and are designed to alert
15 the driver to obstacles while parking.

16 “Rear visibility system” means devices or components installed
17 on a motor vehicle at the time of manufacture that allow a forward
18 facing driver to view a visual image of the area directly behind the
19 vehicle.

22 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

24 STATEMENT

25
26 This bill clarifies that a probationary driver’s license applicant is
27 permitted to use a rear view backup camera when taking the road
28 test administered by the Motor Vehicle Commission. In addition,
29 the bill clarifies that a license applicant may utilize a vehicle’s
30 parking sensors, which are designed to alert a driver to obstacles
31 while parking.

32 In 2007, Congress passed the Cameron Gulbransen Kids
33 Transportation Safety Act which required all newly manufactured
34 motor vehicles to be equipped with a backup camera by May 2018.
35 The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration anticipates
36 that the law will reduce accidents involving children, persons with
37 disabilities, the elderly, and other pedestrians who have the highest
38 risk associated with back-over crashes.

39 Because all new motor vehicles will be equipped with a backup
40 camera and many vehicles are sold with a parking sensor option, it
41 is the sponsor’s intent to allow a person to use this ubiquitous
42 technology while taking a road test.

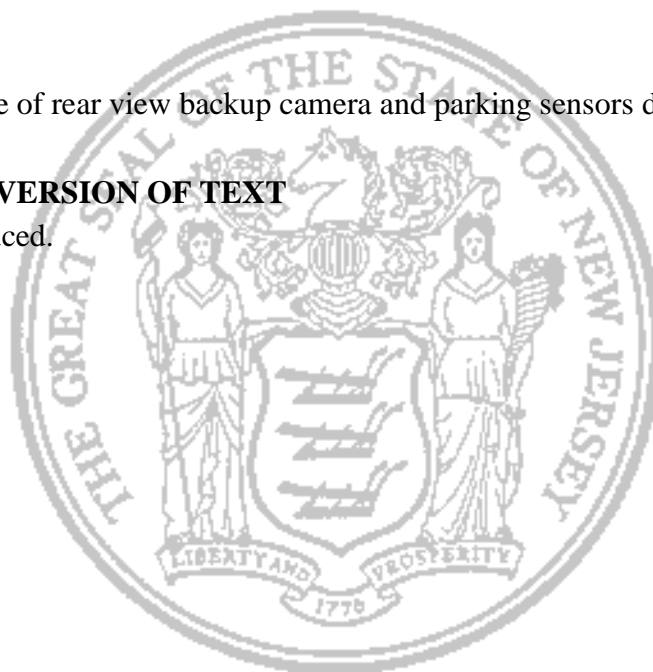

Takes Action On Other Pending Legislation

Trenton, NJ - Governor Chris Christie today signed legislation allowing any municipality to operate a Syringe Access Program (SAP), while directing the state Health Commissioner to invest \$200,000 for syringes and supplies for the five existing pilot programs. The increased funding will provide more than a year's worth of needed syringes and supplies to the existing programs in Atlantic City, Camden, Jersey City and Newark and Paterson. The Governor line item vetoed \$95,000 the Legislature originally proposed in the Fiscal Year 2017 budget because it was insufficient to meet the needs of these programs.

"Individuals struggling with the disease of addiction are more likely to seek treatment if they participate in a Syringe Access Program," said Governor Christie. "These are programs that provide life-saving access to an array of vital services including testing, counseling and education as well as preventing the transmission of blood-borne diseases such as HIV and Hepatitis."

SAPs have served nearly 22,000 individuals and each year distribute more than one million sterile syringes. In addition, the use of Naloxone (commonly known as "Narcan") by these programs has saved over 40 lives.

AJR-46/SJR-57 (Schaer, Eustace, Benson, Johnson, Pinkin/Singer, Gordon) - Creates the "New Jersey Biotechnology Task Force"

AJR-103/SJR-70 (Houghtaling, Downey, Mukherji/Madden, O'Toole) - Designates November of each year as "Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month"

S-2361/A-3951 (Weinberg, Sarlo, Gordon/Vainieri Huttie, Lagana, Eustace, Caride, Mukherji, Schepisi) –**CONDITIONAL** - Authorizes certain county to establish county hospital authority; amends title of "Municipal Hospital Authority Law"

A-1877/S-1129 (Wimberly, Sumter, Jasey, Johnson/Rice, Ruiz) – **CONDITIONAL** - "Healthy Small Food Retailer Act"; provides funding to small food retailers to sell fresh and nutritious food

A-2576/S-1080 (Gusciora, Muoio, Caputo, Mukherji, Chiaravalloti, Houghtaling, Pintor Marin/Turner) –**CONDITIONAL** - Extends duration of urban enterprise zones for 10 additional years; specifies permissible use of funds
