The department will need to research all available programs throughout the Executive Branch and conduct outreach to both federal and State departments. Once the research is conducted the information will need to be compiled into a user friendly format and published on the internet. As programs change, they will need to be updated and that information kept current on the timeline. All of these tasks will require staff time and may result in additional duties for a staff person. It cannot be determined if the department will hire any additional staff or if the tasks will be added to a current employee's duties. However, any additional costs to perform these tasks will be administrative and will most likely be funded within current administrative appropriations.

Additionally, the bill may result in greater awareness of available programs for individuals with developmental disabilities and may increase enrollment in, and expenditures for, these programs, but it is not possible to quantify this effect.

Takes Action on Pending Legislation

Trenton, NJ — Governor Chris Christie today signed a package of legislation designed to make New Jerseyans safer. The measures include requirements for schools to conduct yearly security training alongside first responders (A-3349/S-2438) and that existing and any new school architectural plans include certain security measures (A-3348/S-2439). Additionally, A-1946/S-1257 expands domestic violence statutes to include cyber-harassment.

"We must make every effort to ensure New Jersey citizens are safe and secure whether they are in their school buildings or online," said Governor Christie. "These new laws will require safety measures to be built into new school construction and all school personnel to be trained annually on safety and security. Additionally, I have signed a bill to address one of the fastest growing threats we face in the 21st century, cyber-harassment. This new law will help victims of domestic violence whose abusers choose to attack through the web and social media outlets."
