Also, the bill would require that the adopted regulations be consistent with (1) the Interstate Fishery Management Plan for Striped Bass of the ASMFC, and (2) other applicable State laws concerning striped bass.

Finally, the bill would repeal two State laws directly regulating the taking of striped bass, including the law amended by the bill, but this repeal would not take effect until the 365th day following the date of enactment of the bill into law or upon the date of adoption of the regulations required pursuant to section 1 of the bill, whichever is earlier.

With enactment into law of this bill, catch limits, seasons and most other restrictions and conditions on the taking of striped bass would no longer be established specifically by statutory law, but instead would be set by the DEP, subject to the disapproval of the Marine Fisheries Council as provided pursuant to sections 5 and 6 of P.L.1979, c.199 (C.23:2B-5 and C.23:2B-6). The bill would not repeal or amend the existing statutory prohibitions against the sale or netting of striped bass.

This bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 4146 which was also reported by the committee.
