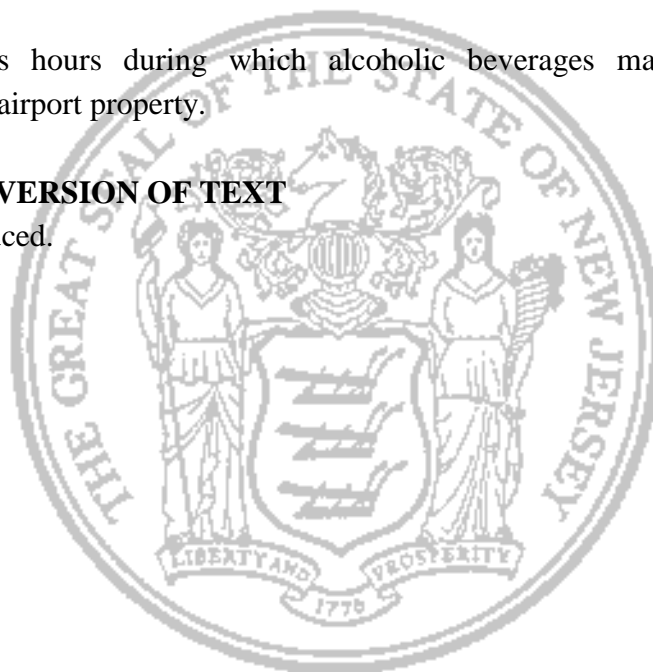

In general, a municipality may establish by ordinance the hours during which alcoholic beverages may be sold for consumption on the premises. This bill establishes extended hours of sale for retail licensees operating an establishment located within an international airport.

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2419 (1R).

As reported by the committee, this bill allows bars and restaurants operating within an international airport to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 3:00 a.m.

In general, a municipality may establish by ordinance the hours during which alcoholic beverages may be sold for consumption on the premises of licensed retailers. This bill establishes extended hours during which bars and restaurants operating within an international airport may sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 1841, as amended and reported by the committee on this same date.

Assembly Bill No. 2419 establishes extended hours during which bars and restaurants operating within an international airport may sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises.

The Senate Law and Public Safety Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 1841.

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill allows bars and restaurants operating within an international airport to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 3:00 a.m.

In general, a municipality may establish by ordinance the hours during which alcoholic beverages may be sold for consumption on the premises of licensed retailers. The amended bill establishes extended hours during which bars and restaurants operating within an international airport may sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises. As introduced, the bill allowed alcoholic beverages to be sold for consumption between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m. within these establishments. The committee amendments change the time during which these alcoholic beverage sales are permitted to between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 3:00 a.m.

As amended and reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2419 (1R), also reported by the committee on this same date.

#### COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:

As introduced, the bill allowed bars and restaurants operating within an international airport to sell alcoholic beverages between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m. The committee amendments change the time during which alcoholic beverages may be sold to between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 3:00 a.m.
