## P.L. 2017, CHAPTER 279, *approved January 8, 2018*Assembly, No. 4790

**AN ACT** providing for the issuance of "Equality" license plates and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

**BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

- 1. a. Upon proper application, the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall issue "Equality" license plates for any motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in this State. In addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, the license plate shall display the Garden State Equality, LLC ("Garden State Equality") emblem, consisting of: an image of a silhouette of the mathematical equivalency sign in the background and the shape of the State of New Jersey in a circle in the foreground. The chief administrator shall select the design and color scheme, in consultation with Garden State Equality. The "Equality" license plates shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.
- b. Application for issuance of an "Equality" license plate shall be made to the chief administrator on forms and in a manner prescribed by the chief administrator. In order to be deemed complete, an application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50, payable to the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, which shall be in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. The chief administrator shall collect annually, subsequent to the year of issuance of the "Equality" license plates, a \$10 fee for the license plates in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. The additional fees required by this subsection shall be deposited in the "Equality License Plate Fund" created pursuant to subsection c. of this section.
- c. There is created in the Department of the Treasury a special non-lapsing fund to be known as the "Equality License Plate Fund." There shall be deposited in the fund the amount collected from all license plate fees collected pursuant to subsection b. of this section, less the amounts necessary to reimburse the commission for administrative costs pursuant to subsection d. of this section. Monies deposited in the fund shall be appropriated annually to Garden State Equality and shall be used to support lesbian, gay,

- e. The chief administrator shall notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain "Equality" license plates by publicizing the availability of the license plates on the commission's website. Garden State Equality, and any other individual or entity designated by the organization, may publicize the availability of the "Equality" license plates in any manner that the organization deems appropriate.
- f. The chief administrator and Garden State Equality shall develop and enter into a memorandum of agreement setting forth the procedures to be followed in carrying out their respective responsibilities under P.L. , c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).
- g. The Executive Director of Garden State Equality shall appoint a representative who shall act as a liaison between Garden State Equality and the commission. The liaison shall represent Garden State Equality in any and all communications with the

#### **STATEMENT**

This bill authorizes the Chief Administrator (chief administrator) of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (commission) to issue special "Equality" license plates. The proceeds of the fund are to be annually appropriated to Garden State Equality to be used to support lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender advocacy and educational programs in the State.

The commission is required to annually certify the average cost of producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the specialty license plates. If the average cost per plate exceeds \$50 in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the "Equality" license plate program. The bill also requires that the Executive Director of Garden State Equality appoint a liaison to represent Garden State Equality in all communications with the commission regarding the "Equality" license plates.

The bill provides that State or other public funds are not to be used by the commission for the initial cost to implement the "Equality" license plate program. The bill requires Garden State Equality, or the individual or entity designated by Garden State Equality, to contribute non-public monies, not to exceed \$25,000, to

The provisions of the bill will remain inoperative until the appropriate applications and fees required to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission are provided by Garden State Equality or its designee. The bill expires after 12 months if sufficient applications and fees to offset the initial costs are not received.

- The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) finds that the bill will have a limited net fiscal impact on the State. The bill establishes the Equality license plate program in such a manner that the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) may fully recover the expenses it incurs in administering the program. It is unclear how many applications for the specialty license plate the MVC will receive.
- The MVC has identified its initial cost of designing and establishing a new license plate series as \$62,000, which is largely attributable to computer system changes. The per plate cost of an initial 550 plate run from the vendor is \$6.60 per plate, for a total cost of \$65,700.
- The MVC will receive a \$50 Equality license plate application fee as revenue in addition to a \$10 annual renewal fee. Fee collections will first reimburse the MVC for the expenses it incurs in administering the license plate program. Excess balances will then be deposited into the "Equality License Plate Fund" for disbursement to Garden State Equality, LLC. In addition, the MVC will have to receive an initial payment of up to \$25,000 and a minimum of 500 completed Equality license plate applications from Garden State Equality representatives, for a total of \$50,000 to offset initial costs before license plate production begins. The MVC will be then be permitted to retain amounts from the \$10 annual renewal fee until it is fully reimbursed for its costs. After the MVC has recovered its costs, all revenues from the \$50 new application fee and the \$10 renewal fee will accrue to Garden State Equality, LLC.



#### **BILL DESCRIPTION**

#### **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**

#### OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS finds that the bill will have a limited net fiscal impact on the State. The bill establishes the Equality license plate program in such a manner that the MVC may fully recover the expenses it incurs in administering the program. But the MVC may also, at its discretion, operate the program at a net cost. It is unclear how many applications for the specialty license plate the MVC will receive. If the amount of applications for license plates is less than 500 in the first 12 months following the effective date the bill will expire without creation of the license plate program. If the amount of applications for license plates is greater than 500, the MVC will

be able to recover its costs within three years of the creation of the program, from the initial fees and the three years of annual renewal fees.

Before the MVC begins designing and producing the license plates, Garden State Equity, LLC or an entity designated by the organization is required to provide \$25,000 and pre-register 500 applicants for the license plates. This requirement ensures that the MVC will be able to recover its initial costs in producing the license plates, and if enough funds are not provided, the MVC will not be required to produce the license plates. The fee is required to come from private sources, so the \$25,000 is not expected to be a State or local cost.

Upon production of the license plates, the MVC may still discontinue the program if the cost of license plate production exceeds \$50 per license plate, which is the initial fee that the MVC will collect for each license plate. This ensures that the MVC will not experience any net costs in the administration of this license plate program. The current cost per plate to the MVC is \$6.60 per plate so it is unlikely that the MVC will experience any net cost in the administration of the program.

The MVC provided information in response to OLS budget questions indicating that the MVC faces an upfront cost of \$65,700 to setup a license plate program, which includes computer changes and the initial print run of 550 license plates. The requirements of the bill would provide the MVC with the first \$50,000 of those costs through the initial \$25,000 and first 500 license plate sales. The remaining \$15,700 will either be recovered through the sale of additional Equality license plates or by retaining the \$10 annual fee. The first 500 plate sales will generate \$5,000 per year from the \$10 annual renewal fee, so even if no other plates were purchased under the program, the MVC would recover the remaining \$15,000 in costs after 3 years of the annual fee collection.

Under the bill the MVC is limited in its ability to obtain net revenues through the program because the bill requires the MVC to deposit all funds that it collects through program fees into a special fund to be appropriated to Garden State Equality, LLC, once the MVC has subtracted its costs in administering the program. This provision prevents the MVC from realizing net revenues in administering the program. The combination of guaranteed fee collection for MVC and the limit on retaining any fees greater than its costs, creates a scenario where there is likely to be no fiscal impact to the MVC in the administration of this license plate program.

AN ACT providing for the issuance of "Equality" license plates and supplementing chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes.

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BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. a. Upon proper application, the Chief Administrator of the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission shall issue "Equality" license plates for any motor vehicle owned or leased and registered in this State. In addition to the registration number and other markings or identification otherwise prescribed by law, the license plate shall display the Garden State Equality, LLC ("Garden State Equality") emblem, consisting of: an image of a silhouette of the mathematical equivalency sign in the background and the shape of the State of New Jersey in a circle in the foreground. The chief administrator shall select the design and color scheme, in consultation with Garden State Equality. The "Equality" license plates shall be subject to the provisions of chapter 3 of Title 39 of the Revised Statutes, except as hereinafter otherwise specifically provided.
- b. Application for issuance of an "Equality" license plate shall be made to the chief administrator on forms and in a manner prescribed by the chief administrator. In order to be deemed complete, an application shall be accompanied by a fee of \$50, payable to the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission, which shall be in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. The chief administrator shall collect annually, subsequent to the year of issuance of the "Equality" license plates, a \$10 fee for the license plates in addition to the fees otherwise prescribed by law for the registration of a motor vehicle. The additional fees required by this subsection shall be deposited in the "Equality License Plate Fund" created pursuant to subsection c. of this section.
- 34 There is created in the Department of the Treasury a special non-lapsing fund to be known as the "Equality License Plate Fund." There shall be deposited in the fund the amount collected from all license plate fees collected pursuant to subsection b. of this section, less the amounts necessary to reimburse the commission for administrative costs pursuant to subsection d. of this section. 40 Monies deposited in the fund shall be appropriated annually to Garden State Equality and shall be used to support lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender advocacy and educational programs in the State. Monies deposited in the fund shall be held in interest-bearing 44 accounts in public depositories as defined pursuant to section 1 of P.L.1970, c.236 (C.17:9-41), and may be invested or reinvested in 46 securities approved by the State Treasurer. Interest or other income earned on monies deposited into the fund, and any monies which may be appropriated or otherwise become available for the purposes

of the fund, shall be credited to and deposited in the fund for use as set forth in P.L., c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill).

- d. Prior to the deposit of the additional fees collected pursuant to subsection b. of this section into the "Equality License Plate Fund," amounts thereof as are necessary shall be used to reimburse the commission for all costs reasonably and actually incurred, as stipulated by the chief administrator, for:
- (1) designing, producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the "Equality" license plates; and
- (2) any computer programming changes that may be initially necessary to implement the "Equality" license plate program in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.

The chief administrator shall annually certify to the State Treasurer the average cost per license plate incurred in the immediately preceding year by the commission in producing, issuing, renewing, and publicizing the availability of the "Equality" license plates. The annual certification of the average cost per license plate shall be approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor.

In the event that the average cost per license plate as certified by the chief administrator and approved by the Joint Budget Oversight Committee, or its successor, is greater than the \$50 application fee established in subsection b. of this section in two consecutive fiscal years, the chief administrator may discontinue the issuance of "Equality" license plates.

- e. The chief administrator shall notify eligible motorists of the opportunity to obtain "Equality" license plates by publicizing the availability of the license plates on the commission's website.   - (1) Garden State Equality, or the individual or entity designated by Garden State Equality, has provided the commission with the money necessary, as determined by the chief administrator pursuant to subsection b. of this section, to offset the initial costs incurred by the commission in establishing the "Equality" license plate program; and
  - (2) The liaison appointed by Garden State Equality pursuant to subsection g. of section 1 of P.L. , c. (C. ) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) has provided the commission with not less than 500 completed applications for "Equality" license plates. These applications shall constitute the initial order for "Equality" license plates and shall be accompanied by a fee representing the total cost of the initial order. The fee shall be determined by multiplying the number of sets of license plates being ordered by the applicable initial fee for each set of license plates as set forth in subsection b. of section 1 of P.L. , c.
