The attending, covering, or resident physician, the attending advanced practice nurse, or the county medical examiner who provides the death and last sickness particulars for a death certification shall provide or offer to provide any examination, screening, test, report, or certification as shall be necessary for the survivor of the deceased person to prosecute a claim for State or federal benefits arising from the deceased person's death. The examination, screening, test, report, or certification shall be provided upon request by the survivor, and shall be offered in any case in which the attending, covering, or resident physician, the attending advanced practice nurse, or the county medical examiner is aware that a valid claim for State or federal benefits is likely to exist.

2. This act shall take effect immediately.

#### **STATEMENT**

This bill requires the attending, covering, or resident physician, the attending advanced practice nurse, or the county medical examiner who provides the death and last sickness particulars for a death certification to provide, or offer to provide, any examination, screening, test, report, or certification as may be necessary to prosecute a claim for State or federal benefits arising out of the deceased person's death. The professional certifying the death will be required to provide the examination, screening, test, report, or certification upon request by the deceased person's survivor, and is required to offer to provide them in any case in which the professional is aware that there may be a valid claim for State or federal benefits.

The Senate Health, Human Services and Senior Citizens Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2320.

As amended by the committee, this bill requires the attending, covering, or resident physician, the attending advanced practice nurse, or the county medical examiner who provides the death and last sickness particulars for a death certification to provide, or offer to provide, any examination, screening, test, report, or certification as may be necessary to prosecute a claim for State or federal benefits arising out of the deceased person's death. The professional certifying the death will be required to provide the examination, screening, test, report, or certification upon request by a survivor of the deceased person.

The committee amended the bill to specify that the examination, screening, test, report, or certification is to be provided to "a survivor," rather than "the survivor," of a decedent, upon request; and to eliminate the provision of the bill that would have required a professional to offer such examination, screening, test, report, or certification in any case where the attending, covering, or resident physician, attending advanced practice nurse, or county medical examiner is aware that a valid claim for benefits is likely to exist.
