This bill allows a person authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife in the Department of Environment Protection to use a certified tracking dog on a lead to search for and recover deer lost by a hunter during any hunting season for deer prescribed by the State Fish and Game Code.

As reported, this bill is identical to the Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 1616, as also reported by the committee.

The Assembly Appropriations Committee reports favorably an Assembly Committee Substitute for Assembly Bill No. 1616.

This Committee Substitute revises current law, R.S.23:4-46, which prohibits a person from using a dog, at any time, or for any reason, to hunt for, track, search for, seek, capture, or kill a wild deer. This substitute bill allows a person authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife in the Department of Environment Protection to use a certified tracking dog on a lead to search for and recover deer lost by a hunter during any hunting season for deer prescribed by the State Fish and Game Code.

As reported, this substitute bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2400, as also reported by the committee.
