1. R.S.39:3-10 is amended to read as follows:

39:3-10. <sup>1</sup>[No] A<sup>1</sup> person shall <sup>1</sup>not<sup>1</sup> drive a motor vehicle on a public highway in this State unless the person is under supervision while participating in a behind-the-wheel driving course pursuant to section 6 of P.L.1977, c.25 (C.39:3-13.2a) or is in possession of a validated permit, or a probationary or basic driver's license issued to that person in accordance with this article.

<sup>1</sup>[No]  $\underline{A}^1$  person under 18 years of age shall  $\frac{1}{not}^1$  be issued a basic license to drive motor vehicles, <sup>1</sup> [nor shall] and <sup>1</sup> a person <sup>1</sup>shall not<sup>1</sup> be issued a validated permit, including a validated examination permit, until the applicant has passed a satisfactory examination and other requirements as to the applicant's ability as an operator. The commission may waive the road test for any person 18 years of age or older possessing a valid driver's license issued by any other state, the District of Columbia, or the United States Territories of American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, or the Virgin Islands. The road test shall be given on public streets, where practicable and feasible, but may be preceded by an off-street screening process to assess basic skills. The commission shall approve locations for the road test which pose no more than a minimal risk of injury to the applicant, the examiner, and other motorists. <sup>1</sup>[No new] New locations for the road test shall <sup>1</sup>not <sup>1</sup> be approved unless the test can be given on public streets.

A person who successfully completes a road test for a motorcycle license or a motorcycle endorsement when operating a motorcycle or motorized scooter with an engine displacement of less than 231 cubic centimeters shall be issued a motorcycle license or endorsement restricting the person's operation of '[such] the' vehicles to any motorcycle with an engine displacement of 500 cubic centimeters or less. A person who successfully completes a road test for a motorcycle license or motorcycle endorsement when operating a motorcycle with an engine displacement of 231 or more cubic centimeters shall be issued a motorcycle license or endorsement without any restriction as to engine displacement. Any person who successfully completes an approved motorcycle safety education course established pursuant to the provisions of section 1 of P.L.1991, c.452 (C.27:5F-36) shall be issued a motorcycle license or endorsement without restriction as to engine displacement.

The commission shall issue a basic driver's license to operate a motor vehicle other than a motorcycle to a person over 18 years of age who previously has not been licensed to drive a motor vehicle in this State or another jurisdiction only if that person has: (1) operated a passenger automobile in compliance with the requirements of this title for not less than one year, not including any period of suspension or postponement, from the date of issuance of a probationary license pursuant to section 4 of P.L.1950, c.127 (C.39:3-13.4); (2) not been assessed more than two motor vehicle points; (3) not been convicted in the previous year for a violation of R.S.39:4-50, section 2 of P.L.1981, c.512 (C.39:4-50.4a), <sup>3</sup>section 1 of <sup>3</sup> P.L.1992, c.189 (C.39:4-50.14), R.S.39:4-129, N.J.S.2C:11-5, subsection c. of N.J.S.2C:12-1, or any other motor vehicle-related violation the commission determines to be significant and applicable pursuant to regulation; and (4) passed an examination of the applicant's ability to operate a motor vehicle pursuant to this section.

The commission shall expand the driver's license examination by <sup>1</sup>[20%] 20 percent<sup>1</sup>. The additional questions to be added shall consist solely of questions developed in conjunction with the Department of Health concerning the use of alcohol or drugs as related to highway safety. The commission shall develop, in conjunction with the Department of Health, supplements to the driver's manual which shall include information necessary to answer any question on the driver's license examination concerning alcohol or drugs as related to highway safety.

Up to 20 questions may be added to the examination on subjects to be determined by the commission that are of particular relevance to youthful drivers, including the dangers of driving a vehicle in an aggressive manner, which shall include, but not be limited to, unexpectedly altering the speed of a vehicle, making improper or erratic traffic lane changes, disregarding traffic control devices, failing to yield the right of way, and following another vehicle too closely, after consultation with the Director of the Division of Highway Traffic Safety in the Department of Law and Public Safety.

The commission shall expand the driver's license examination to include a question asking whether the applicant is aware of the provisions of the "Revised Uniform Anatomical Gift Act," P.L.2008, c.50 (C.26:6-77 et al.) and the procedure for indicating on the driver's license the intention to make a donation of body organs or tissues pursuant to <sup>3</sup> section 1 of <sup>3</sup> P.L.1978, c.181 (C.39:3-12.2).

The commission shall expand the driver's license examination to include a question asking whether the applicant is aware of the dangers of failing to comply with this State's motor vehicle traffic laws and the "STOP for Nikhil Safety Pledge" set forth in subsection e. of R.S.39:3-41.

Any person applying for a driver's license to operate a motor vehicle or motorized bicycle in this State shall surrender to the commission any current driver's license issued to the applicant by another state or jurisdiction upon the applicant's receipt of a driver's license for this State. The commission shall refuse to issue a driver's license if the applicant fails to comply with this provision. An applicant for a permit or license who is less than 18 years of age, and who holds a permit or license for a passenger automobile issued by another state or country that is valid or has expired within a time period designated by the commission, shall be subject to the permit and license requirements and penalties applicable to State permit and license applicants who are of the same age; except that if the other state or country has permit or license standards substantially similar to those of this State, the credentials of the other state or country shall be acceptable.

The commission shall create classified licensing of drivers covering the following classifications:

- a. Motorcycles, except that for the purposes of this section, motorcycle shall not include any three-wheeled motor vehicle equipped with a single cab with glazing enclosing the occupant, seats similar to those of a passenger vehicle or truck, seat belts and automotive steering or any vehicle defined as a motorcycle pursuant to R.S.39:1-1 having a motor with a maximum piston displacement that is less than 50 cubic centimeters or a motor that is rated at no more than 1.5 brake horsepower with a maximum speed of no more than 35 miles per hour on a flat surface.
- b. Omnibuses as classified by R.S.39:3-10.1 and school buses classified under N.J.S.18A:39-1 et seq.
  - c. (Deleted by amendment, P.L.1999, c.28) **[.]**
- d. All motor vehicles not included in classifications a. and b. A license issued pursuant to this classification d. shall be referred to as the "basic driver's license."

Every applicant for a license under classification b. shall be a holder of a basic driver's license. Any issuance of a license under classification b. shall be by endorsement on the basic driver's license.

A driver's license for motorcycles may be issued separately, but if issued to the holder of a basic driver's license, it shall be by endorsement on the basic driver's license. The holder of a basic driver's license or a separately issued motorcycle license shall be authorized to operate a motorcycle having a motor with a maximum piston displacement that is less than 50 cubic centimeters or a motor that is rated at no more than 1.5 brake horsepower with a maximum speed no more than 35 miles per hour on a flat surface.

The commission, upon payment of the lawful fee and after it or a person authorized by it has examined the applicant and is satisfied of the applicant's ability as an operator, may, in its discretion, issue a license to the applicant to drive a motor vehicle. The license shall 1 authorize [him] the person to drive any registered vehicle, of the 2 kind or kinds indicated [, and].

The commission may, at its discretion and for good cause shown, issue licenses which shall expire on a date fixed by it. If the commission issues a license to a person who has demonstrated authorization to be present in the United States for a period of time shorter than the standard period of the license, the commission shall fix the expiration date of the license at a date based on the period in which the person is authorized to be present in the United States under federal immigration laws. The commission may renew [such al the license only if it is demonstrated that the person's continued presence in the United States is authorized under federal law. The fee for licenses with expiration dates fixed by the commission shall be fixed by the commission in amounts proportionately less or greater than the fee herein established.

The commission shall waive the payment of fees for issuance of omnibus endorsements whenever an applicant establishes to the commission's satisfaction that [said] the applicant will use the omnibus endorsement exclusively for operating omnibuses owned by a nonprofit organization duly incorporated under Title 15 or 16 of the Revised Statutes or Title 15A of the New Jersey Statutes.

The commission shall issue licenses for the following license period on and after the first day of the calendar month immediately preceding the commencement of [such] the period, [such] the licenses to be effective immediately.

All applications for renewals of licenses shall be made in a manner prescribed by the commission and in accordance with procedures established by it.

The commission in its discretion may refuse to grant a permit or license to drive motor vehicles to a person who is, in its estimation, not a proper person to be granted [such] a permit or license, but <sup>1</sup>[no] a<sup>1</sup> defect of the applicant shall <sup>1</sup>not<sup>1</sup> debar the applicant from receiving a permit or license unless it can be shown by tests

In addition to requiring an applicant for a driver's license to submit satisfactory proof of identity and age, the commission also shall require the applicant to provide, as a condition for obtaining a permit and license, satisfactory proof that the applicant's presence in the United States is authorized under federal law.

If the commission has reasonable cause to suspect that any document presented by an applicant as proof of identity, age or legal residency is altered, false 1,1 or otherwise invalid, the commission shall refuse to grant the permit or license until [such] the time as the document may be verified by the issuing agency to the commission's satisfaction.

A person violating this section shall be subject to a fine not exceeding \$500 or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 60 days, but if that person has never been licensed to drive in this State or any other jurisdiction, the applicant shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$200 and, in addition, the court shall issue an order to the commission requiring the commission to refuse to issue a license to operate a motor vehicle to the person for a period of not less than 180 days. The penalties provided for by this paragraph shall not be applicable in cases where failure to have actual possession of the operator's license is due to an administrative or technical error by the commission.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to alter or extend the expiration of any license issued prior to the date this amendatory and supplementary act becomes operative.

As used in this section:

"Parking sensors" means proximity sensors which use either electromagnetic or ultrasonic technology and are designed to alert the driver to obstacles while parking.

"Rear visibility system" means devices or components installed on a motor vehicle at the time of manufacture that allow a forward facing driver to view a visual image of the area directly behind the vehicle.

#### **STATEMENT**

This bill provides that a person's driver's license expires four years after issuing the license on the numerical date of the person's birthday.

Under current law, a person's driver's license expires on the last day of the 48th month after the license was issued. Under this bill, a person's driver's license would expire during the 48th calendar month after the license was issued and on the numerical calendar day that corresponds to the person's numerical day of birth. If the person's numerical day of birth does not correspond with a numerical calendar day in the 48th month, the license is to expire on the last day of the 48th month.

According to the sponsor, the intent of this bill is to reduce the lines and wait time at Motor Vehicle Commission offices by having a person's driver's license expire on the day of his or her birthday, rather than on the last day of the month.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Senate Bill No. 2564.

As amended and reported, this bill provides that a person's driver's license or identification card expires four years after issuing the license or identification card on the person's birthday.

Under current law, a person's driver's license expires on the last day of the 48th month after the license was issued. Under this bill, as amended and reported, a person's driver's license or identification card would expire during the fourth calendar year after the license or identification card was issued and on the person's day of birth. If the person's day of birth does not correspond with a calendar day in the fourth calendar year, the license or identification card is to expire on the last day of the month of the person's birth.

The committee amended the bill to include identification cards in the documentation to expire four years after issuance on the person's birthday. The amendments clarify that the expiration of a document is to occur on the person's birthday and not on the numerical day of the person's day of birth of the calendar month in which the license or identification card was issued. The amendments make additional technical changes to correct certain grammatical errors.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 2564 (1R), with committee amendments.

As amended, this bill provides that a person's driver's license or identification card expires four years after issuing the license or identification card on the person's birthday.

Under current law, a person's driver's license expires on the last day of the 48th month after the license was issued. Under this bill, a person's driver's license or identification card would expire during the fourth calendar year after the license or identification card was issued and on the person's day of birth. If the person's day of birth does not correspond with a calendar day in the fourth calendar year, the license or identification card is to expire on the last day of the month of the person's birth.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS:**

The amendments clarify that the change in issuance and renewal periods will only apply to licenses and cards issued or renewed on and after the effective date, which is the first day of the seventh month after enactment. The amendments also make technical amendments to clarify that the fee paid to the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) is for the new, applicable period of licensing, and is not based on the current 48-month period as is currently provided in the statutory fee schedule.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

The Office of Legislative Services notes that this bill will have no fiscal impact on the MVC. The fiscal impact to the MVC in issuing a driver's license or identification card is based on the cost to produce the license or card, and not the frequency of the issuance of the license or card. Therefore, although some licenses or cards will be renewed in a period less than or greater than 48 months, depending on the issuance date and the date of the person's birthday, there will be no fiscal impact on the MVC as a result of the bill. The bill does not

affect the cost to produce a drivers' license or identification card or the payment the MVC receives for each license or card issued.

It is possible that the MVC will save staffing costs in eliminating potential overtime pay on the last working day of each month. Currently, driver's licenses expire on the last day of the 48th month after the license was issued, and it is possible that MVC pays certain employees overtime pay on the last working day of the month to accommodate the higher volume of persons wishing to renew their licenses. This bill distributes driver license renewals throughout the month, thus eliminating the need to pay certain employees overtime pay. The potential savings to the MVC is indeterminate without information regarding the MVC's staffing costs and needs.

Motorcycles, except that for the purposes of this section, motorcycle shall not include any three-wheeled motor vehicle equipped with a single cab with glazing enclosing the occupant, seats similar to those of a passenger vehicle or truck, seat belts and automotive steering or any vehicle defined as a motorcycle pursuant to R.S.39:1-1 having a motor with a maximum piston displacement that is less than 50 cubic centimeters or a motor that is rated at no more than 1.5 brake horsepower with a maximum speed of no more than 35 miles per hour on a flat surface.
- b. Omnibuses as classified by R.S.39:3-10.1 and school buses classified under N.J.S.18A:39-1 et seq.
  - c. (Deleted by amendment, P.L.1999, c.28).
- d. All motor vehicles not included in classifications a. and b. A license issued pursuant to this classification d. shall be referred to as the "basic driver's license."

Every applicant for a license under classification b. shall be a holder of a basic driver's license. Any issuance of a license under classification b. shall be by endorsement on the basic driver's license.

A driver's license for motorcycles may be issued separately, but if issued to the holder of a basic driver's license, it shall be by endorsement on the basic driver's license. The holder of a basic driver's license or a separately issued motorcycle license shall be authorized to operate a motorcycle having a motor with a maximum piston displacement that is less than 50 cubic centimeters or a motor that is rated at no more than 1.5 brake horsepower with a maximum speed no more than 35 miles per hour on a flat surface.

The commission, upon payment of the lawful fee and after it or a person authorized by it has examined the applicant and is satisfied of the applicant's ability as an operator, may, in its discretion, issue a license to the applicant to drive a motor vehicle. The license shall authorize [him] the person to drive any registered vehicle, of the kind or kinds indicated [, and].

The license shall expire, except as otherwise provided, [on the last day of ] during the 48th calendar month following the calendar month in which [such] the license was issued and on the same numerical calendar day as the person's numerical day of birth. If the person's numerical day of birth does not correspond to a numerical calendar day of the 48th calendar month, the license shall expire on the last day of the 48th calendar month.

The commission may, at its discretion and for good cause shown, issue licenses which shall expire on a date fixed by it. If the commission issues a license to a person who has demonstrated authorization to be present in the United States for a period of time shorter than the standard period of the license, the commission shall fix the expiration date of the license at a date based on the period in

The commission shall waive the payment of fees for issuance of omnibus endorsements whenever an applicant establishes to the commission's satisfaction that **[**said**]** the applicant will use the omnibus endorsement exclusively for operating omnibuses owned by a nonprofit organization duly incorporated under Title 15 or 16 of the Revised Statutes or Title 15A of the New Jersey Statutes.

The commission shall issue licenses for the following license period on and after the first day of the calendar month immediately preceding the commencement of [such] the period, [such] the licenses to be effective immediately.

All applications for renewals of licenses shall be made in a manner prescribed by the commission and in accordance with procedures established by it.

The commission in its discretion may refuse to grant a permit or license to drive motor vehicles to a person who is, in its estimation, not a proper person to be granted [such] a permit or license, but no defect of the applicant shall debar the applicant from receiving a permit or license unless it can be shown by tests approved by the commission that the defect incapacitates the applicant from safely operating a motor vehicle.

In addition to requiring an applicant for a driver's license to submit satisfactory proof of identity and age, the commission also shall require the applicant to provide, as a condition for obtaining a permit and license, satisfactory proof that the applicant's presence in the United States is authorized under federal law.

If the commission has reasonable cause to suspect that any document presented by an applicant as proof of identity, age or legal residency is altered, false or otherwise invalid, the commission shall refuse to grant the permit or license until [such] the time as the document may be verified by the issuing agency to the commission's satisfaction.

A person violating this section shall be subject to a fine not exceeding \$500 or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 60 days, but if that person has never been licensed to drive in this State or any other jurisdiction, the applicant shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$200 and, in addition, the court shall issue an

This bill provides that a person's driver's license expires four years after issuing the license on the numerical date of the person's birthday.

Under current law, a person's driver's license expires on the last day of the 48th month after the license was issued. Under this bill, a person's driver's license would expire during the 48th calendar month after the license was issued and on the numerical calendar day that corresponds to the person's numerical day of birth. If the person's numerical day of birth does not correspond with a numerical calendar day in the 48th month, the license is to expire on the last day of the 48th month.

According to the sponsor, the intent of this bill is to reduce the lines and wait time at Motor Vehicle Commission offices by having a person's driver's license expire on the day of his or her birthday, rather than on the last day of the month.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The Assembly Transportation and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 4115.

As amended and reported, this bill provides that a person's driver's license or identification card expires on the person's birthday in the fourth year following issuance of the license or identification card. If the person's birthday does not correspond with a calendar day in the fourth calendar year, the license or identification card is to expire on the last day of the month of the person's birth.

#### **COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS**

The committee amended the bill to: update section 1 of the bill to include the changes made to that section of law as amended by P.L.2016, c.41 (approved August 31, 2016); include identification cards as a type of documentation that expires on the person's birthday in the fourth year following issuance of the card; provide that the expiration of a document is to occur on the person's birthday and not on the numerical day of the person's day of birth of the calendar month in which the license was issued; provide that the provisions of the bill apply only to licenses and identification cards issued or renewed on or after the effective date of the bill; and make additional technical changes to correct certain grammatical errors.

#### **BILL SIGNINGS:**

S-295/A-2334 (Vitale, Sarlo/Benson, Vainieri Huttle, Mazzeo, Mukherji, Downey, Wimberly) - Requires DOH to issue standing order authorizing pharmacists to dispense opioid antidotes to patients without individual prescriptions

S-651/A-4262 (Turner, Pennacchio/Muoio, Lampitt, Chiaravalloti, Mukherji, Jimenez) - Requires family day care providers and certain household members to undergo criminal history record background checks

S-972wGR/A-1788 (Sweeney, O'Toole, Ruiz/Burzichelli, Giblin, Pintor Marin) – Establishes Child Advocacy Center-Multidisciplinary Team Advisory Board and certification program for child advocacy centers and multidisciplinary teams; appropriates \$10 million

S-2564/A-4115 (Weinberg, A.R. Bucco/Johnson, Vainieri Huttle, A.M. Bucco, Quijano, Holley, Mukherji) - Provides that driver's license and identification cards expire every four years on licensee or cardholder's birthday

AJR-91/SJR-71 (Tucker, Johnson, Holley, Downey/Beach, Van Drew) - Designates June 27 of each year as "Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder Awareness Day"

#### **BILL VETOED:**

A-4352/S-2843 (Burzichelli, Taliaferro/Sweeney) – CONDITIONAL - Provides for elimination of newly formed nonoperating school districts; establishes procedures for eliminating deficit that existed prior to merger; authorizes renting of school building for 10 years
