The Assembly Transportation and Independent Authorities Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 374.

As reported, this bill prohibits the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission from imposing duplicate identification card fees and replacement driver's license fees, including the digitized picture fee, if a person requests the duplicate identification card or replacement driver's license solely for the purpose of reflecting that the person has become an organ donor. Currently, the cost of having a duplicate identification card or replacement driver's license issued is \$11, including the digitized picture fee.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2016-2017 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

The Senate Transportation Committee reports favorably and with committee amendments Assembly Bill No. 374.

As amended and reported, this bill prohibits the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (MVC) from imposing duplicate identification card fees and replacement driver's license fees, including the digitized picture fee, if a person requests the duplicate identification card or replacement driver's license solely for the purpose of reflecting that the person has become an organ donor. Currently, the cost of having a duplicate identification card or replacement driver's license issued is \$11, including the digitized picture fee.

The committee amended the bill to require that in order for a person to receive a replacement driver's license or duplicate identification card under the provisions of the bill, the person is required to first surrender the person's current driver's license or identification card to the MVC.

As amended and reported, Assembly Bill No. 374 is identical to Senate Bill No. 2462, which was also amended and reported by the committee on this date.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 374 (1R).

This bill prohibits the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (“MVC”) from imposing duplicate identification card fees and replacement driver’s license fees, including the digitized picture fee, if a person requests the duplicate identification card or replacement driver’s license solely for the purpose of reflecting that the person has become an organ donor. Currently, the cost of having a duplicate identification card or replacement driver’s license issued is \$11, including the digitized picture fee.

In order for a person to receive a replacement driver’s license or duplicate identification card under this bill, the person is required to first surrender their current driver’s license or identification card to the MVC. This requirement forestalls signing up as an organ donor to avoid paying the replacement fee for a lost license or card.

As reported, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 2462 (1R), as also reported by the committee.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Office of Legislative Services expects the bill will likely result in reduced State revenue arising from organ donors who elect to obtain a replacement license or identification card before the expiration of their current driver’s license or identification card. The amount of lost revenue is equal to the number of persons who elect to become organ donors and request a replacement driver’s license or identification card before the expiration of their current license or card, multiplied by \$11. It appears, however, that a significant portion of persons elect to become an organ donor at the time they obtain their initial driver’s license or identification card, or upon renewing a license or card; these persons would not be impacted by the bill.

The MVC does not maintain data about the reason individuals request replacement licenses so it is not possible to determine the number of those requests that would be subject to this bill. It appears that a significant portion of people who do elect to become organ donors do so at motor vehicle facilities at the time they obtain their initial drivers' license or renew a license that is expiring. A person would already be obtaining a new license in those situations so they would not be impacted by this bill. The subset of individuals who register to become an organ donor at other times and then request a duplicate license to reflect their new organ donor status appears to be relatively small, compared to the total number of organ donors and the total number of duplicate license requests.

S-806/A-2463 (Weinberg, Gordon/Eustace, Vainieri Huttie, Caride, Muio, Lagana, Lampitt, Mukherji) – CONDITIONAL - Requires owner or operator of certain trains to have discharge response, cleanup, and contingency plans to transport certain hazardous materials by rail; requires NJ DOT to request bridge inspection reports from US DOT

S-3006/A-4589 (Weinberg, Gordon/Vainieri Huttie, Quijano, Wisniewski, Johnson, Mukherji) – ABSOLUTE - Prohibits PANYNJ from providing assistance for enforcement of March 6, 2017 US Executive Order banning entry into US of individuals from certain countries

A-1855/S-3123 (Wimberly, Prieto, Oliver, Sumter/Cruz-Perez, Cunningham) – CONDITIONAL - Concerns outreach and training for minorities and women in the construction industry

A-4701/S-3059 (Eustace, Zwicker, Vainieri Huttie, Gusciora, Kennedy, Benson, Jasey/Sweeney, Smith) – ABSOLUTE - Requires State full participation in Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative
