BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey:

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- 1. Section 3 of P.L.1950, c.142 (C.39:3-84.1) is amended to read as follows:

The axle weight limitations as provided at [R.S.39:3-84b.] 10 subsection b. of R.S.39:3-84 shall apply to all vehicles registered in 11 New Jersey subsequent to March 1, 1950, which have not been 12 registered therein or contracted for purchase by New Jersey 13 residents prior to that date. The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 3616.

This bill provides an exception, consistent with federal law, to the vehicle weight limits for vehicles operated by engines fueled primarily by natural gas. The bill permits a natural gas vehicle to exceed a vehicle weight limit, up to a maximum gross vehicle weight of 82,000 pounds, by an amount equal to the difference between the weight of the natural gas tank and fueling system and the weight of a comparable diesel tank and fueling system.

This exception makes State law consistent with recently enacted provisions of federal law concerning weight limits for natural gas vehicles.
