As amended, this bill provides that a student who receives a scholarship or is already in the program is eligible to take less than 12 credits in a semester if: the student presents to the institution at which the student is enrolled a written note from a physician or other licensed health care professional indicating the student's need to take a reduced number of credits due to a physical or mental health condition; or if the student provides to the institution verification of the recent death of the student's parent or spouse. A student who receives a medical exemption, or an exemption due to the recent death of the student's parent or spouse, from the full-time course of study requirement will be eligible for additional semesters in the scholarship program, as necessary.

The committee amended the bill to allow NJ STARS and NJ STARS II scholarship recipients to maintain program eligibility in the event that the recent death of the student's parent or spouse prevents enrollment as a full-time student.

The Senate Higher Education Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2565 (2R).

Under current law, a recipient of an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II scholarship must maintain status as a full-time student unless on a medical leave or emergency leave or unless called to partial or full mobilization for State or federal active duty as a member of the National Guard or a Reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United States. As amended, this bill provides that a student who receives a scholarship or is already in the program is eligible to take less than 12 credits in a semester if: the student presents to the institution at which the student is enrolled a written note from a physician or other licensed health care professional indicating the student's need to take a reduced number of credits due to a physical or mental health condition; or if the student provides to the institution verification of the recent death of the student's parent or spouse. A student who receives a medical exemption, or an exemption due to the recent death of the student's parent or spouse, from the full-time course of study requirement will be eligible for additional semesters in the scholarship program, as necessary.

The bill provides that an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II scholarship recipient who takes less than 12 credits in a semester due to a physical or mental health condition, or because of the recent death of the student's parent or spouse: (1) must take a minimum of six credits a semester to receive an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II payment for that semester; and (2) will receive an additional semester of eligibility for each semester that the student receives an exemption from the full-time course of study requirement. The amount of NJ STARS II scholarship awards for part-time students will be prorated so that students who take six to eight credits a semester will receive one-half of the value of a full-time award, and students who take nine to 11 credits will receive three-quarters of a full-time award. The current statutory cap on the total amount of NJ STARS II payments, \$5,000 per student, remains in effect regardless of a student's part-time status.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 888, which was amended and also reported by the committee on this same date.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Assembly Bill No. 2565 (2R).

This bill allows NJ STARS and NJ STARS II scholarship recipients to maintain program eligibility in the event that certain circumstances prevent a student from maintaining full-time enrollment.

Under current law, a recipient of an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II scholarship must maintain status as a full-time student (at least unless 12 credit hours) unless on a medical leave or emergency leave or unless called to partial or full mobilization for State or federal active duty as a member of the National Guard or a Reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United States. This bill would allow a student to receive a scholarship while taking no less than six credits if: 1) the student documents, through a written note from a physician or licensed health care professional, a need to take fewer credits due to a physical or mental health condition, or 2) the student verifies the recent death of a parent or spouse. A student who receives such an exemption will be eligible for one additional semester in the scholarship program for each semester for which the student received the exemption, up to a maximum of five additional semesters for NJ STARS, and four additional semesters for NJ STARS II.

As reported, this bill is identical to Senate Bill No. 888 (1R), as also reported by the committee.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) notes that this bill would lead to an indeterminate increase in State expenditures as the bill would provide scholarships to students who would otherwise be made ineligible under current law. However, the OLS is not able to predict the number of students who would take a reduced number of credits either due to a physical or mental health condition or due to the death of a parent or spouse.

These floor amendments provide that an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II scholarship recipient who takes less than 12 credits in a semester due to a physical or mental health condition, or because of the recent death of the student's parent or spouse: (1) must take a minimum of six credits a semester to receive an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II payment for that semester; and (2) will receive an additional semester of eligibility for each semester that the student receives an exemption from the full-time course of study requirement. The amendments also prorate the amount of NJ STARS II scholarship awards for part-time students so that students who take six to eight credits a semester will receive one-half of the value of a full-time award, and students who take nine to 11 credits will receive three-quarters of a full-time award. The amendments clarify that the current statutory cap on the total amount of NJ STARS II payments, \$5,000 per student, remains in effect regardless of a student's part-time status.

A grade for credits 33 earned during a summer semester shall for the purposes of this 34 subsection be included in the calculation of the cumulative grade 35 point average.
  - d. A student shall be eligible to receive a scholarship under the NJ STARS II Program for the student's fourth academic year of study if the student: received a scholarship under the NJ STARS II Program for the student's third academic year of study pursuant to subsection c. of this section; based on the student's performance during the third academic year of study, attained a grade point average of at least 3.25; and meets the criteria set forth in subsection e. of this section. A grade for credits earned during a summer semester shall for the purposes of this subsection be included in the calculation of the grade point average for the preceding academic year.
- e. To be eligible to receive a scholarship under the NJ STARS II Program, a student shall:

(1) be a State resident pursuant to guidelines established by the 2 authority. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1 of P.L.1979, c.361 (C.18A:62-4) or any other section of law to the contrary, a 4 dependent child of a parent or guardian who has been transferred to a military installation located in this State shall be considered a resident of this State for the purposes of qualifying for an NJ STARS II scholarship;

- (2) have applied for all other available forms of State and federal need-based grants and merit scholarships, exclusive of loans, the full amount of which grants and scholarships shall be applied to tuition, and fee charges if applicable, to reduce the amount of any scholarship that the student shall receive under the provisions of P.L.2005, c.359 (C.18A:71B-86.1 et seq.);

Beginning in the 2015-2016 academic year, a student who receives an NJ STARS II scholarship or a student who is already in the NJ STARS II program shall be eligible to take less than 12 credits in a semester if the student provides to the four-year public or independent institution of higher education a written note from a physician or other licensed health care professional indicating the student's need to take a reduced number of credits due to a physical or mental health condition. The Senate Higher Education Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 888 with committee amendments.

Under current law, a recipient of an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II scholarship must maintain status as a full-time student unless on a medical leave or emergency leave or unless called to partial or full mobilization for State or federal active duty as a member of the National Guard or a Reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United States. As amended, this bill provides that a student who receives a scholarship or is already in the program is eligible to take less than 12 credits in a semester if: the student presents to the institution at which the student is enrolled a written note from a physician or other licensed health care professional indicating the student's need to take a reduced number of credits due to a physical or mental health condition; or if the student provides to the institution verification of the recent death of the student's parent or spouse. A student who receives a medical exemption, or an exemption due to the recent death of the student's parent or spouse, from the full-time course of study requirement will be eligible for additional semesters in the scholarship program, as necessary.

As amended, the bill provides that an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II scholarship recipient who takes less than 12 credits in a semester due to a physical or mental health condition, or because of the recent death of the student's parent or spouse: (1) must take a minimum of six credits a semester to receive an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II payment for that semester; and (2) will receive an additional semester of eligibility for each semester that the student receives an exemption from the full-time course of study requirement. The amount of NJ STARS II scholarship awards for part-time students will be prorated so that students who take six to eight credits a semester will receive one-half of the value of a full-time award, and students who take nine to 11 credits will receive three-quarters of a full-time award. The current statutory cap on the total amount of NJ STARS II payments, \$5,000 per student, remains in effect regardless of a student's part-time status.

The committee amended the bill to allow NJ STARS and NJ STARS II scholarship recipients to maintain program eligibility in the event that the recent death of the student's parent or spouse prevents

enrollment as a full-time student. The committee also amended the bill to provide that an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II scholarship recipient who takes less than 12 credits in a semester due to an allowed medical or bereavement exemption: (1) must take a minimum of six credits a semester to receive an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II payment for that semester; and (2) will receive an additional semester of eligibility for each semester that the student receives an exemption from the full-time course of study requirement. The amendments also provide for the prorating of the amount of NJ STARS II scholarship awards for part-time students and clarify that the current statutory cap on the total amount of NJ STARS II payments, \$5,000 per student, remains in effect regardless of a student's part-time status.

As reported by the committee, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2565(2R), which was also reported by the committee on this same date.

This bill was pre-filed for introduction in the 2016-2017 session pending technical review. As reported, the bill includes the changes required by technical review, which has been performed.

The Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee reports favorably Senate Bill No. 888 (1R).

This bill allows NJ STARS and NJ STARS II scholarship recipients to maintain program eligibility in the event that certain circumstances prevent a student from maintaining full-time enrollment.

Under current law, a recipient of an NJ STARS or NJ STARS II scholarship must maintain status as a full-time student (at least unless 12 credit hours) unless on a medical leave or emergency leave or unless called to partial or full mobilization for State or federal active duty as a member of the National Guard or a Reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United States. This bill would allow a student to receive a scholarship while taking no less than six credits if: 1) the student documents, through a written note from a physician or licensed health care professional, a need to take fewer credits due to a physical or mental health condition, or 2) the student verifies the recent death of a parent or spouse. A student who receives such an exemption will be eligible for one additional semester in the scholarship program for each semester for which the student received the exemption, up to a maximum of five additional semesters for NJ STARS, and four additional semesters for NJ STARS II.

As reported, this bill is identical to Assembly Bill No. 2565 (2R), as also reported by the committee.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT**:

The Office of Legislative Services (OLS) notes that this bill would lead to an indeterminate increase in State expenditures as the bill would provide scholarships to students who would otherwise be made ineligible under current law. However, the OLS is not able to predict the number of students who would take a reduced number of credits either due to a physical or mental health condition or due to the death of a parent or spouse.

#### BILL DESCRIPTION

Senate Bill No. 888 (1R) of 2016 under current law, one condition of receiving a scholarship under one of the New Jersey Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarships programs (NJ STARS for students enrolled in a county college, and NJ STARS II for students who subsequently enroll in a four-year college), a student must enroll in a course of study that includes at least 12 credit hours in a semester. Senate Bill No. 888 (1R) of 2016 would allow a student to receive a scholarship while taking no less than six credits if: 1) the student documents, through a written note from a physician or licensed health care professional, a need to take fewer credits due to a physical or mental health condition, or 2) the student verifies the recent death of a parent or spouse. A student who receives such an exemption will be eligible for one additional semester in the scholarship program for each semester for which the student received the



exemption, up to a maximum of five additional semesters for NJ STARS, and four additional semesters for NJ STARS II.

#### **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**

#### OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE SERVICES

The OLS notes that Senate Bill No. 888 (1R) would lead to an increase in State expenditures. Under current law, a scholarship recipient under the NJ STARS and NJ STARS II programs is, under most circumstances, required to maintain continuous enrollment in a full-time course of study, defined as a minimum of 12 credit hours in a semester. To the extent that Senate Bill No. 888 (1R) would allow a student to retain a scholarship, despite enrolling in fewer than 12 credit hours, or allows the student additional semesters of scholarship eligibility, the bill would lead to an increase in State expenditures. However, the OLS is not able to estimate the potential cost, as it does not have information regarding the potential number of students who would be impacted by the bill's provisions.
