STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to increase the New Jersey Highway Authority from three to five members, and to decrease the terms of the members from 9 to 5 years, as was authorized pursuant to P. L. 1969, chapter 263 and to conform expiration of the terms of the two new members with the expiration of the terms of the existing members of the authority. The New Jersey Highway Authority, whose primary function is the operation of the Garden State Parkway but, of late has also included additional projects like the construction of the Garden State Art Center, is approximately a ½ billion dollar operation. The Garden State Parkway traverses 144 miles on its north-south route along the coast of New Jersey, and it is the main link between our fastgrowing shore areas and the heavily populated northeastern section of the State, and the country. The size and the importance of this public corporation require that the New Jersey Highway Authority have sufficient representation for the interested and affected segments of the population and geographical areas. The pressing needs of our State further require that the operation of the highway authority be continually attuned to these needs, and that its membership be subject to frequent legislative and executive scrutiny to this effect. This bill provides for greater representation by increasing the membership on the authority, and for frequent scrutiny by the legislative and executive branches by decreasing the terms of authority members to 5 years, with one term ending every year.
