An Act to amend "An act concerning salaries of members of the governing body in certain towns, supplementing subtitle 10 of Title 40 of the Revised Statutes," approved April 21, 1951 (P. L. 1951, c. 43).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1951, chapter 43 (C. 40:132-1.1) is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 1. In any town having a population exceeding 20,000 in which
- 4 the legal voters have not fixed and determined the salary or other
- 5 compensation to be paid the members of the governing body other
- 6 than the mayor, pursuant to section 40:46-26 of the Revised Stat-
- 7 utes, such salary or other compensation may be fixed by the gov-
- 8 erning body, by ordinance, at not exceeding [\$2,500.00] \$4,000.00
- 9 per annum. Any such ordinance shall become operative 30 days
- 10 after the publication thereof after its final passage, unless within
- 11 said 30 days, a petition, signed by legal voters of such town equal
- 12 in number to at least 15% of the entire vote cast in the last pre-
- 13 ceding general election, protesting against the passage of such
- 14 ordinance, be presented to the governing body, in which case such
- 15 ordinance shall remain inoperative unless and until a proposition
- 16 for the ratification thereof shall be adopted at the next general
- 17 election by a majority of the qualified voters voting on said
- 18 proposition.
- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
