AN ACT to amend "An act providing for the licensing and regulation of convalescent and nursing home administrators, and supplementing chapter 11 of Title 30 of the Revised Statutes," approved November 26, 1968 (P. L. 1968, c. 356).

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Section 3 of the act of which this act is amendatory is amended
2 to read as follows:

3 3. Upon receipt of an application for license and a license fee
4 of \$25.00, and an examination fee of \$50.00, the department shall
5 cause an investigation to be made of the applicant and shall issue
6 a license if it is found that said applicant is of good moral char-
7 acter and complies with the provisions of this act, the regulations
8 of the department and the minimum standards established for the
9 administration of a convalescent home or private nursing home.
10 The license shall not be transferable or assignable and shall be
11 posted in a conspicuous place on the licensed premises wherein the
12 individual acts as an administrator, as prescribed by the regula-
13 tions of the department. The State Board of Control of the De-
14 partment of Institutions and Agencies, with the advice of the nurs-
15 ing home administrator's licensing board, shall adopt, amend,
16 promulgate and enforce such rules, regulations, and minimum
17 standards for the training, experience and education of individuals
18 acting as administrators of convalescent homes and private nurs-
19 ing homes to be licensed hereunder as may be reasonably necessary
20 to accomplish the purposes of this chapter. Such rules, regulations
21 and minimum standards when adopted shall be binding upon all
22 licensees and applicants for license under this chapter. Licensees
23 and applicants for a license as a convalescent home or private
4 nursing home administrator of an institution or home conducted

25 exclusively for persons who rely upon treatment by spiritual means
26 alone through prayer in accordance with the creed or tenets of
27 a recognized church or religious denomination as described in
28 P. L. 1947, chapter 340, section 9 (C. 30:11-9) shall meet all rules,
29 regulations, and minimum standards prescribed by the board except
30 medical rules, regulations, and minimum standards.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

STATEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to provide revenue to defray the costs of conducting the examinations provided for herein to ascertain the ability of administrators of convalescent homes or private nursing homes to perform the duties of such position.
