An Act relating to salaries of the mayor and councilmen in boroughs in counties of the fifth class and amending R. S. 40:87-60.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. R. S. 40:87-60 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 40:87-60. The salaries of the mayor and councilmen shall be
- 3 governed by article 6 of chapter 46 of this Title (§ 40:46-23 et seq.),
- 4 except in boroughs in counties of the first class having less than
- 5 800,000 inhabitants, in which boroughs they may be fixed by ordi-
- 6 nance at not in excess of \$1,500.00 per year for the mayor and
- 7 \$1,000.00 per year for each councilman, and except in boroughs in
- 8 counties of the second class having less than 265,000 inhabitants
- 9 and in counties of the third class, in which boroughs they may be
- 10 fixed by ordinance at an annual salary or at a rate not in excess of
- 11 \$15.00 for the mayor and \$10.00 for each councilman, for each day
- 12 actually engaged in discharging the duties of their respective offices,
- 13 but, in either case, not to exceed \$1,500.00 per year for the mayor
- 14 and \$1,000.00 per year for each councilman, and except in boroughs
- 15 in counties of the fourth [class and boroughs in counties of the],
- 16 fifth and sixth class, in which boroughs they shall be fixed by
- 17 ordinance as in the case of other salaries. All other officers shall
- 18 be paid such salary or compensation as the council may by ordi-
- 19 nance fix.
- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.
