AN ACT relating to Rutgers, The State University, and amending N. J. S. 18A :65-25.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. N. J. S. 18A:65-25 is amended to read as follows:

18A:65-25. The board of governors shall have general supervision over and be vested with the conduct of the university. It
shall have the authority and responsibility to:

a. Determine policies for the organization, administration and
development of the university;

b. Study the educational and financial needs of the university,
annually acquaint the Governor and Legislature with the condition
of the university, and prepare and, jointly with the Board of Higher
Education, present the annual budget to the Governor and Legislature, in accordance with law;

c. Disburse all moneys appropriated to the university by the Legislature, moneys received from tuition, fees, auxiliary services and other sources, and from or by direction of the board of trustees; d. Direct and control **[** the expenditures of the corporation and the university] expenditure and transfer of funds appropriated to the corporation and the university by the State in accordance with the provisions of the State budget and appropriation acts of the Larielature **[** 1, and as to funds received from the trustees]

19 the Legislature [,]; and, as to funds received from the trustees EXPLANATION—Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law. and other sources, direct and control expenditures and transfers in accordance with the terms of any applicable trusts, gifts, bequests, or other special provisions, reporting changes and additions thereto and transfers thereof to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the State Department of the Treasury. All accounts of the university shall be subject to **[**post**]** audit by the State at any time.

27e. Borrow money for the needs of the corporation and the university, as deemed requisite by the board, in such amounts and for 2829such time and upon such terms as may be determined by the board, with the consent and advice of the board of trustees; provided, 30 that no such borrowing shall be deemed or construed to create or 31constitute a debt, liability, or a loan or pledge of the credit, or be 32payable out of property or funds (other than moneys appropriated 33 34 for that purpose) of the State;

35 f. 1. Purchase all lands, buildings, equipment, materials and 36 supplies; and

2. Employ architects to plan buildings; secure bids for the construction of buildings and for the equipment thereof; make contracts for the construction of buildings and for equipment; and supervise the construction of buildings;

g. Manage and maintain, and provide for the payment of all
charges on and expenses in respect of, all properties utilized by
the university;

h. In accordance with the provisions of the budget, have the sole 44 power (subject to the provisions of section 18A:65-31) to elect, 45appoint, remove, promote or transfer all corporate, official, edu-**4**6 cational and civil administrative personnel, and fix and determine 47 their salaries in accordance with salary schedules adopted by the 48 board of governors and approved by the Board of Higher Educa-49 tion. Such salary schedules shall prescribe qualifications for the 50various classifications and shall limit the percentage of the educa-51 tional staff that may be appointed or promoted to any given 52° 53classification;

i. In accordance with the provisions of the budget, appoint, remove, promote and transfer all other officers, agents, or employees, assign their duties, determine their salaries, and prescribe qualifications for all positions, and in accordance with the salary schedules of the State Civil Service Commission wherever possible; and

j. Authorize any new educational department or school which will
require, at the time of establishment, or which may thereafter
require, an additional expenditure of money beyond that appropri-

63 ated, if the establishment thereof is approved by the Board of
64 Higher Education and provision is made therefor in the annual or
65 a supplemental appropriation act or a special act of the Legislature
