Referred to Committee on Agriculture, Conservation and Natural Resources

AN ACT concerning licensed game preserves and amending sections 23:3-29, 23:3-32 and 23:3-37 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. Section 23:3-29 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 23:3-29. A person desiring to engage in the business of raising and selling game birds or game animals, or both, in a wholly in-4 closed preserve of which he is the owner or lessee, or to have in 5 captivity game birds or game animals, shall immediately apply in 6 7 writing to the division for a license to do so. The license fee shall 8 be \$5.00 per annum for each of the above purposes. A person desiring to propagate pheasants, partridge, wild turkey or quail, or any 9 of them, in a semiwild state on lands of which he is the owner or 1011 lessee, shall apply in writing to the division for a license to do so. The license fee shall be \$25.00 per annum. 12

13 The division, when it appears that the application is made in
14 good faith, shall, upon the payment of the fee for each license,
15 issue to the applicant such of the following license or licenses
16 as may be applied for:

a. Propagating license permitting the licensee to propagate game birds or game animals, or both, in the wholly inclosed preserve the location of which is stated in the license and the application therefor, and to sell such propagated game birds or game animals, or both, and ship them from the State alive at any time and to kill the same and sell the carcasses for food subject to the conditions prescribed by sections 23:3-28 to 23:3-39 of this Title;

b. License to propagate pheasants, partridge, wild turkey or
 quail, or any of them, in a semiwild state on lands of which the

26applicant is the owner or lessee, when the applicant shall have 27[produced evidence satisfactory to the division that he has released, or already has, on land described in the application and 2829license, of the species for which he desires to be licensed, at least 30 10 female and 2 male pheasants or at least 6 female and 6 male quail, or partridge or such total number of pheasants, partridge and quail, 31 32to each 100 acres of land, or a proportionate number of such birds for less than 100 acres, prior to May 1 in the calendar year for 33 34which the license is to be issued released during the month of October, in the presence of the conservation officer, of the species for 35 which the applicant desires to be licensed, one bird for each 5 acres 36 37 of land described in the application and license;

38 c. License to keep game birds and animals in captivity; or

d. A person desiring to operate a "commercial pheasant, wild
turkey, quail and partridge-shooting preserve" on lands of which
he is the owner or bona fide lessee [may] shall apply in writing
to the division for a license so to do. The license fee shall be
\$100.00 per annum and the form of the application and license shall
be determined by the division.

The division may, upon payment of the fee, issue to the applicant
such a license when it appears that:

47 (1) The operation of such shooting preserve shall not conflict48 with a prior reasonable public interest; and

(2) The applicant shall produce evidence satisfactory to the divi-49 sion that he has released on lands described in the application and 50 license, of the species for which he desires to be licensed, a total of 51 at least 10 female and 2 male pheasants or 6 female and 6 male 52quail or partridge for the first 100 acres of land or portion thereof, 53or a proportionate number of birds for any acreage in excess of 54the first 100 acres, prior to May 1 in the [calendar] year for which 55 the license is to be issued; and 56

(3) The applicant shall have produced evidence satisfactory to
the division that he will raise or purchase for liberation and liberate on the shooting preserve a total of at least 500 pheasants,
quail and partridge or combination thereof between September 1 of
the year for which the license was issued and the following March
15.

1 2. Section 23:3-32 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read 2 as follows:

23:3-32. No pheasants, wild turkeys, partridge or quail propa-4 gated in a semiwild state shall be sold. No such pheasants, wild 5 turkeys, partridge or quail shall be possessed or transported out-6 side of licensed areas unless each bird shall have been tagged with

7 the special tag prescribed by sections 23:3-28 to 23:3-39 of this 8 Title. Except as to the additional tags hereinafter provided for, no licensee raising pheasants, partridge or quail in a semiwild 9 10state shall procure from the division during any year of operation more tags to be affixed to the dead bodies of pheasants, partridge 11 or quail propagated in a semiwild state than **[**4 times the number 1213of] the number equal to 4/5 of the number of pheasants, partridge or quail released [prior to May 1] during the month of October 14 15in each year. Additional tags may be provided to any licensee in 16[number equal to 4/5 of the number of] the same ratio for any 17 birds released [after May 1 in each year] subsequent to October in the license year. The tags shall be of a special kind provided for 18 19 the purpose. The number of birds taken in any year, either alive 20or dead, on lands on which preasants, wild turkeys, partridge or 21quail are propagated in a semiwild state shall not exceed the num-22ber of tags obtained from the division. Pheasants, wild turkeys, 23and partridge propagated in a semiwild state may be taken by shooting only from 9:00 A. M. on November 10 or such opening 24date as may otherwise be prescribed by the State Fish and Game 2526Code to January 20, except where the licensee shall have produced evidence satisfactory to the division that he has liberated on the 27land during the year covered by his license, or that he has in his 2829possession on the land or in some other designated place or places 30 and will liberate on the land prior to February 28 a total of at least 100 pheasants and partridge or combination thereof for any 31 acreage up to 100 acres and at least one pheasant or partridge 32for each additional acre, in addition to those birds released during 33 the month of October, in which case the licensee or any person or 34persons authorized by him so to do may take pheasants, wild 35turkeys and partridge by shooting from 9:00 A. M. on November 36 10 or such opening date as may otherwise be prescribed by the 37 38State Fish and Game Code to the next following February 28, both inclusive, and during any further period, not exceeding 31 days, 39which the Commissioner of Conservation and Economic Develop-40 ment may, from time to time, designate for that purpose upon the 41 42recommendation of the Director of the Division of Fish and Game of the Department of Conservation and Economic Development 43on the land described in his license. The number of pheasants, 44 wild turkeys, quail, and partridge so taken by shooting shall not 4546 exceed ⁴/₅ of the total number of pheasants, wild turkeys, quail, and partridge liberated on said land during the year covered by such 47 license. Section 23:4-24 of this Title relating to hunting on Sunday 48 shall not apply to any person authorized to shoot pheasants, wild 49

turkeys, quail, and partridge under sections 23:3-28 to 23:3-39 of 50 this Title. Quail propagated in a semiwild state may be taken by 51 shooting only from 9:00 A. M. on November 10 or such opening 5253date as may otherwise be prescribed by the State Fish and Game Code to the next following February 28, both days inclusive, and 54during any further period, not exceeding 31 days, which the Com-55missioner of Conservation and Economic Development may, from 56 57time to time, designate for that purpose upon the recommendation of the Director of the Division of Fish and Game of the Depart-58 ment of Conservation and Economic Development. No pheasants, 59 wild turkeys, partridge or quail propagated in a semiwild state 60 61 shall be trapped without the written permission of the division. 62Under a "commercial pheasant, wild turkey, quail and partridgeshooting preserve" license, pheasants, wild turkeys, quail and 63 64 partridge may be taken by shooting only on lands described in the 65 application and license, without regard to sex and daily bag limit, by fully licensed hunters authorized by the licensee to shoot on 66 said land between September 1 and the following March 15, both 67 dates inclusive and during any further period, not exceeding 31 68 69 days, which the Commissioner of Conservation and Economic Development may, from time to time, designate for that purpose 70 upon the recommendation of the Director of the Division of Fish 71 72and Game of the Department of Conservation and Economic 73 Development.

74All pheasants, wild turkeys, quail and partridge liberated on 75a "commercial pheasant, wild turkey, quail and partridge-shooting preserve" for which a license has been issued shall first be banded 76 77with a leg band which shall bear upon it a symbol identifying the 78 shooting preserve, and a description of said band and symbol shall 79 be set forth in the application for license.] No pheasants, wild 80 turkeys, quail or partridge shall be possessed or transported 81 outside the licensed area, unless each bird shall have been tagged 82with a suitable tag or seal supplied by the division, and no licensee 83 shall receive from the division, during any year of operation, more 84 tags to be affixed to the bodies of pheasants, quail and partridge 85 than 4 times the number of female pheasants, quail and partridge 86 released prior to May 1 in each year, in addition to one tag for 87 each pheasant, wild turkey, quail and partridge liberated during 88 the shooting period hereinbefore specified.

1 3. Section 23:3-37 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read 2 as follows:

3 23:3-37. Each holder of a propagating license shall keep the
4 license prominently displayed at the place of business specified

therein, and shall keep accurate written records which shall include 5 the total number of each species of game birds or animals possessed 6 on the date of application for the license, the number of each 7 species subsequently propagated or acquired by purchase or gift, 8 9 and the name and address of each person or corporation from 10 whom or to whom game birds or animals were purchased or sold alive or sold for food, and the date of each transaction. The holder 11 12of a semiwild or commercial shooting preserve shall keep such records as may be prescribed by the division. These records shall 13 14 be kept permanently on the premises stated in the license and shall be open for inspection by any duly authorized representative of 15the [board] division at all reasonable times. Each holder of a 16 propagating license shall send a certified copy of these records for 17 18 the previous [calendar] license year to the [board] division not later than [January 15] March 31. The [board] division shall 19 furnish the forms on which these records are to be kept. 20

1 4. This act shall take effect January 1, 1971.
