

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 2, 1970

An Act concerning the salaries of court attendants in certain firstclass counties, and amending N. J. S. 2A:11-34.

## STATE OF NEW JERSEY

#### ADOPTED MAY 7, 1970

Amend page 1, section 1, line 3, before "the compensation", reinsert "having between 700,000 and 800,000 inhabitants".

Amend page 1, section 1, line 13, before "fixed", insert "not less than \$4,500.00 per annum and shall not exceed \$6,000.00 per annum, and in counties of the first class having less than 700,000 inhabitants the compensation of said court attendants shall be".

Governor William T. Cahill today signed into law two bills

Governor William T. Cahill today signed into law two bills giving Freeholders in Hudson County the power to set salaries for court attendants and employees of county jails.

Cahill expressed his pleasure in signing the bills and said:

"It is my belief that salary ranges for local employees should be set by local officials."

Assembly bill 451, sponsored by Alfred E. Suminski (D., Hudson), provides that the salaries of guards, helpers, industrial officers and correction officers in first-class counties with populations of less than 700,000 shall be set by the freeholders. The present salary range is \$5,500 to \$7,600.

The second bill, A-452, which was also introduced by Suminski, provides that salaries of court attendants in first-class counties with less than 700,000 population shall be set by the freeholders. The present salary range is from \$4,500 to \$6,000.
