1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

2 2A:11-34. In counties of the first-class [having between 700,000
3 and 800,000 inhabitants,] **having between 700,000 and 800,000 in-*
4 *habitants** the compensation of the court attendants attached, or
5 assigned to the Superior Court, the County Courts, the juvenile
6 and domestic relations court and to the grand jury, and to the

7 said counties, or to such executive or official as may be in charge of
8 such duties, shall be [not less than \$4,500.00 per annum and shall
9 not exceed \$6,000.00 per annum, and in counties of the first class
10 having less than 700,000 inhabitants the compensation of said court
11 attendants shall be not less than \$5,500.00 per annum and shall not
12 exceed \$7,600.00 per annum, with provision for increments in salary
13 between the minimum and maximum of such salaries to be] **not*
14 *less than \$4,500.00 per annum and shall not exceed \$6,000.00 per*
15 *annum, and in counties of the first class having less than 700,000*
16 *inhabitants the compensation of said court attendants shall be**
17 fixed by the board of chosen freeholders [on recommendation of the
18 sheriff], and shall be paid in equal semimonthly installments by

20 fund of the county.

21 This section shall not be construed as permitting the decrease of

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

ADOPTED MAY 7, 1970

Amend page 1, section 1, line 3, before "the compensation", reinsert "having between 700,000 and 800,000 inhabitants".

Amend page 1, section 1, line 13, before "fixed", insert "not less than \$4,500.00 per annum and shall not exceed \$6,000.00 per annum, and in counties of the first class having less than 700,000 inhabitants the compensation of said court attendants shall be".

Governor William T. Cahill today signed into law two bills giving Freeholders in Hudson County the power to set salaries for court attendants and employees of county jails.

Cahill expressed his pleasure in signing the bills and said:

"It is my belief that salary ranges for local employees should be set by local officials."

Assembly bill 451, sponsored by Alfred E. Suminski (D., Hudson), provides that the salaries of guards, helpers, industrial officers and correction officers in first-class counties with populations of less than 700,000 shall be set by the freeholders. The present salary range is \$5,500 to \$7,600.

The second bill, A-452, which was also introduced by Suminski, provides that salaries of court attendants in first-class counties with less than 700,000 population shall be set by the freeholders. The present salary range is from \$4,500 to \$6,000.
