AN ACT concerning toy caps and amending R. S. 21:3-2.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*  
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. R. S. 21:3-2 is amended to read as follows:

2 21:3-2. It shall be unlawful for any person to offer for sale,  
3 expose for sale, sell, possess or use, or explode any blank cartridge,  
4 toy pistol, toy cannon, toy cane or toy gun in which explosives are  
5 used; the type of balloon which requires fire underneath to propel  
6 the same; firecrackers; torpedoes; skyrockets, Roman candles,  
7 bombs, sparklers or other fireworks of like construction, or any  
8 fireworks containing any explosive or inflammable compound or  
9 any tablets or other device commonly used and sold as fireworks  
10 containing nitrates, chlorates, oxalates, sulphides of lead, barium,  
11 antimony, arsenic, mercury, nitroglycerine, phosphorus or any  
12 compound containing any of the same or other explosives, or any  
13 substance or combination of substances, or article prepared for  
14 the purpose of producing a visible or an audible effect by combus-  
15 tion, explosion, deflagration or detonation, other than aviation and  
16 railroad signal light flares, except (a) that it shall be lawful for any  
17 person to offer for sale, expose for sale, sell, possess or use, or ex-  
18 plode any toy pistol, toy cane, toy gun, or other device in which  
19 paper or plastic caps containing .25 grain or less of explosive com-  
20 pound per cap are used, providing they are so constructed that the  
21 hand cannot come in contact with the cap when in place for use, and  
22 toy pistol paper or plastic caps which contain less than .20 grain of  
23 explosive mixture per cap and (b) as in this chapter further pro-  
24 vided.

1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
