AN ACT concerning alcoholic beverage control and supplementing chapter 1 of Title 33 of the Revised Statutes.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Whenever the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on
2 the premises and off the premises or either thereof is authorized
3 in any municipality by ordinance or rule or regulation of the
4 Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control, by the holder of a retail
5 consumption or retail distribution license, such ordinance or rule
6 shall authorize the sale of malt alcoholic beverage in original bottle
7 or can containers for consumption off the premises on the same
8 days and during the same hours as the sale of alcoholic beverages
9 for consumption on the premises is permitted and authorized in
10 said municipality.

11 All parts of ordinances and regulations of the Director of the
12 Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control inconsistent with the provi-
13 sions of this act are superseded to the extent of such inconsistency.

1 2. This act shall take effect 30 days after enactment.

STATEMENT

STATEMENT

This bill would authorize taverns and package stores to sell beer and ale in original containers for consumption off the licensed premises on the same days and during the same hours as taverns are authorized to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises.

S-2108

Governor William T. Cahill today signed into law Senate Bill 2108 which permits taverns to sell beer or ale in the original container and also permits package stores to sell beer or ale during the same days and hours that taverns are authorized to sell alcoholic beverages for off premises consumption.

In signing the bill, sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont, Jr. (R., Sussex) the Governor said that this measure reflects the public's will and is in the public interest. He added that permitting them to sell beer in the original container is both more sanitary and economical.

In addition, the Governor also signed into law the following:

- ~~Senate Bill No. 738 -- which permits clams to be taken with power dredge from specified leased lands under rules and regulations of the State Fisheries Council.~~
- ~~Senate Bill No. 748 -- repeals certain statutes regulating the number of hours per day and days per week a female may work in certain industries.~~
- ~~Senate Bill No. 2221 -- which prohibits any claims against the State where the cause of action accrues prior to April 1, 1972, or after July 1, 1971.~~
- ~~Assembly Bill No. 1335 - which permits the conversion of bank convertible capital notes into common stock of a Bank Holding Company.~~
- ~~Assembly Bill No. 1377 - which permits the appointment of an acting clerk or acting deputy clerk of the municipal court.~~
- ~~Assembly Bill No. 2009 - which extends the Compact of Regional Planning for the Delaware Valley Urban Area from December 31, 1971, to December 31, 1972.~~
