STATEMENT

This bill would authorize taverns and package stores to sell beer and ale in original containers for consumption off the licensed premises on the same days and during the same hours as taverns are authorized to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption on the licensed premises.

Governor William T. Cahill today signed into law Senate Bill 2108 which permits taverns to sell beer or ale in the original container and also permit package stores to sell beer or ale during the same days and hours that taver are authorized to sell alcoholic beverages for off premises consumption.

In signing the bill, sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont, Jr. (R., Sussex) the Governor said that this measure reflects the public's will and is in the public interest. He added that permitting—them—to sell beer in the origination of the container is both more sanitary and economical.

In addition, the Governor also signed into law the following:

Senate Bill No. 738 -- which permits class to be taken with power dredge from specified leased lands under rules and regulation of the State Fisheries Council.

Senate Bill No. 748 -- repeals certain statutes regulating the number of per day and days per week a female may work in condustries.

Senate Bill No. 2221 -- which prohibits any claims against the State whe cause of action accrues prior to April 1, 1972, of July 1, 1971.

Assembly Bill No. 1335 - which permits the conversion of bank covertible capital notes into common stock of a Bank Holdir Assembly Bill No. 1377 - which permits the appointment of an acting clerk acting deputy clerk of the municipal court.

Assembly Bill No. 2009 - which extends the Compact of Regional Planning:
the Delaware Valley Urban Area from December 31
to December 31, 1972.
