- AN ACT concerning cooperative agreements with *State departments, agencies and authorities and* county and municipal governments relating to State- and Federally-financed transportation programs and amending R. S. 27:7-21.
- 1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. R. S. 27:7-21 is amended to read as follows:

2 27:7-21. In addition to, and not in limitation of, his general 3 powers, the commissioner may:

a. Determine and adopt rules, regulations and specifications and
5 enter into contracts covering all matters and things incident to
6 the acquisition, improvement, betterment, construction, reconstruc7 tion, maintenance and repair of State highways;

b. Execute and perform as an independent contractor or through

d. Employ and discharge, subject to the provisions of the Civil

g. The commissioner and his authorized agents and employees

STA'TEMENT

The purpose of this bill is to assist local governments, when the State is requested to do so, in the acquisition of lands related to State- and/or Federally-aided transportation projects. The act is needed since under certain State and Federal programs, funds will be lost if the municipalities cannot operate condemnation programs in accordance with State and Federal standards.

Acting Governor Raymond H. Bateman today signed into law the following bills:

Senate Bill No. 500, sponsored by Senator Harold C. Hollenbeck (R., Bergen), -- which provides for State assistance to local governments, when requested to do so, in the acquisition of lands related to State and/or Federally-financed transportation and related projects.

Senate Bill No. 797, sponsored by Senator Wayne Dumont, Jr., (R., Warren), -- which validates certain proceedings at meetings or elections of school districts and any bonds or other obligations issued or to be issued in pursuance of such proceedings.

<u>Assembly Bill No. 643</u>, sponsored by Assemblywoman Millicent H. Fenwick (R., Somerset), -- which provides that local institutional trustees shall have parole powers; prescribes the method of appointing, removing and filling vacancies on the boards of trustees.

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
