An Act to amend the "Transportation Act of 1966," approved December 12, 1966 (P. L. 1966, c. 301).

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1. Section 1 of P. L. 1966, c. 301 (C. 27:1A-1) is amended to read
- 2 as follows:
- 3 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Transporta-
- 4 tion Act of 1966." It shall be the purpose and intent of this act to
- 5 establish the means whereby the full resources of the State can be
- 6 used and applied in a coordinated and integrated matter to solve or
- 7 assist in the solution of the problems of all modes of transportation;
- 8 to promote an efficient, fully integrated and balanced transportation
- 9 system for the State; to prepare and implement comprehensive
- 10 plans and programs for all modes of transportation development in
- 11 the State; and to coordinate the transportation activities of State
- 12 agencies, State-created public authorities, and other public agencies
- 13 with transportation responsibilities within the State.
- 2. Section 4 of P. L. 1966, c. 301 (C. 27:1A-4) is amended to read
- 2 as follows:
- 3 4. The administrator and head of the department shall be a com-
- 4 missioner, who shall be known as the Commissioner of Transporta-
- 5 tion, and who shall be a person qualified by training and experience
- 6 to perform the duties of his office. The commissioner shall be ap-
- 7 pointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate,
- 8 and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor during the Gover-

 - 6 [the Director of Planning or the Director of Administration] the

- 9 chief engineers are appointed from persons holding positions in
- 10 the classified service of the State, they shall retain, during their

STATEMENT

The proposed amendments would redefine the titles, qualifications and duties of the appointed officials of the department, and bing the statutory language into realistic accord with the actual functions of such officials in carrying out the basic purposes of the 1966 act.

For example, it has been tacitly the practice for one of the assistant commissioners to oversee the day-to-day staff operations of the department. By providing for statutory recognition through a designation of "executive director," this essential function is formalized. Likewise, the designation of the director of administration as "deputy executive director" recognizes the broader scope of responsibilities.

No increase in staff, nor any changes in the stated purposes and functions of the department are proposed in these amendments which are essentially technical in nature.

This bill amends the Transportation Act of 1966 (C. 27:1A-1 et seq.) to redefine the titles, qualifications and duties of the appointed officials of the Department of Transportation and bring the statutory language into accord with the actual functions of such officials. These amendments do not propose any increase in staff.

At present the Commissioner of Transportation is directed to develop and revise from time to time a comprehensive master plan for transportation development. This bill specifies that such plans shall be for modes of transportation with special emphasis on public transportation. At present the commissioner is directed to develop and promote programs to foster efficient and economical public transportation services. This bill deletes the word "public" from this duty. At present the commissioner is directed to prepare plans for the preservation and improvement of the commuter railroad system. This bill directs him to prepare plans for the preservation and improvement of the railroad system, with special emphasis on commuter railroads.

At present the Assistant Commissioner for Highways assist the commissioner in his duties relating to the design and development of highways, and shall be qualified by training and experience to perform these duties. This bill specifies that he be qualified by training and experience relating to highway transportation and safety to perform his duties.

At present the Assistant Commissioner for Public Transportation assists the commissioner in his duties relating to public transportation, and shall be qualified by training and experience to perform his duties. This bill specifies that he be qualified by training and experience relating to rail, bus or other mass or public transportation services to perform his duties, which shall include supervision of an office of commuter services.

The bill provides that one of the assistant commissioners be designated as executive director of the department.

The bill expands the duties of the State Highway Engineer to include the position of director of engineering and operations. He shall be executive director for engineering design, construction and maintenance of all installations under the jurisdiction of the department as well as traffic engineering and State-aid programs for local governments. He shall be a professional engineer qualified by training and actual experience in the design, construction and maintenance of highways, bridges, airports or other transportation facilities and installations.

The titles of the three assistant State Highway Engineers are changed by this bill to three chief engineers for design, construction and maintenance; transportation operations; and local aid, respectively. The chief engineers serve as assistants to the director of engineering and operations—State Highway Engineer. The qualifications for the three chief engineers shall be the same as those prescribed for the director of engineering and operations—State Highway Engineer, except that the chief engineer, transportation operations and local aid shall be also qualified by training and experience in traffic engineering to perform the duties of his office.

The bill changes the title of the Director of Planning to the Director of Planning and Research. He shall assist the commissioner in his duties relating to transportation planning and research.

The bill abolishes the position of Director of Administration and provides that the commissioner may appoint a deputy executive director as assistant to the executive director in the performance of general administrative duties.

The bill abolishes the position of executive director of the Commuter Operating Agency. The Assistant Commissioner for Public Transportation shall supervise the work of the agency in a division of commuter services. The commissioner, acting as chairman of the agency, may appoint a director of commuter services to assist the assistant Commissioner for Public Transportation.

The bill also amends the 10-day period during which the Governor may veto any action of the agency to provide that the 10-day period shall not include Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays.

The bill provides that the salaries for all the new titles shall be established by the commissioner with the approval of the President of the Civil Service Commission and the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting, such salaries not to exceed not in excess of comparable salaries established by P. L. 1969, c. 194 (C. 52:14–15.104), in the case of the positions of the assistant commissioners, the director of engineering and operations—State Highway Engineer.

The bill provides that persons in office as State Highway Engineer, Assistant State Highway Engineers, Director of Planning and Director of Administration on the effective date of this act shall hold their offices until their successors are appointed and have qualified.

The act will take effect on the first day of the month following enactment.

Senate Bill No. 551 amends the "Transportation Act of 1966" by redefining the titles and qualifications and duties of the appointed officials of the Department, and brings the statutory language into realistic accord with the actual functions of such officials in carrying out the basic purposes of the act.

The Department of Transportation states that enactment of this legislation provides for no increase in staff nor does it provide for any change in the stated purposes and functions of the department. Therefore, enactment would not affect the revenues of the State.

In compliance with written request received, there is hereby submitted a fiscal estimate for the above bill, pursuant to P. L. 1962, c. 27.

Governor William T. Cahill today signed into law a bill which modernizes the organization of the Department of Transportation by bringing executive designations into accord with responsibilities.

Senate bill 551, sponsored by Senator Richard R. Stout
(R., Monmouth), amends the Transportation Act of 1966 to redefine
the titles, qualifications and duties of the appointed officials
of the Department. The changes are designed to enable the Department to
function more fully as a comprehensive transportation unit.

Among the changes made by the new law are the specifications that the Assistant Commissioner for Public Transportation shall be qualified by training and experience relating to rail, bus and other mass or public transportation services to perform his duties, which shall include supervision of an office of commuter services.

The bill expands the duties of the State Highway Engineer to include the position of Director of Engineering and Operations, and the titles of the three Assistant State Highway Engineers are changed to Chief Engineer for Design, Chief Engineer for Construction and Maintenance and Chief Engineer for Transportation Operations and Local Aid.

The number of appointed officers is decreased through the deletion of the positions of Executive Director and Deputy Director of Operations of the Commuter Operating Agency.

The Governor also signed Assembly bill 532, sponsored by Assemblyman Eugene Raymond, III (R., Camden), which provides for the reimbursement for expenses to police and firemen of their defense of criminal charges brought against them for acts performed in the line of duty.

Under the new law, counties and municipalities shall provide the means for defense of such actions or proceedings, other than disciplinary or criminal proceedings brought by the county or municipality. In the case of disciplinary or criminal proceeding determined in favor of the policeman or fireman, he shall be reimbursed for the expense of his defense.
