AN ACT concerning pensions for teachers and other employees in certain cases and amending N. J. S. 18A:66-37.

1 BE IT ENACTED by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 2 of New Jersey:

1 1. N. J. S. 18A:66-37 is amended to read as follows:

18A:66-37. Should a member resign after having established 25 2 3 years of creditable service before reaching age 60, he may elect 4 "early retirement," provided, that such election is communicated 5 by such member to the retirement system by filing a written applica-6 tion, duly attested, stating at what time subsequent to the execution and filing thereof he desires to be retired. He shall receive, in lieu 7 of the payment provided in section 18A:66-34, an annuity which is 8 the actuarial equivalent of his accumulated deductions and a 9 pension in the amount which, when added to the member's annuity, 10 will provide a total retirement allowance of 1/70 of his final com-11 pensation for each year of service credited as Class A service and 12 1/60 of his final compensation for each year of service credited as 13 class B service, calculated in accordance with section 18A:66-44, 14 reduced by 1/4 of 1% for each month that the member lacks of being 15 age [60] 55; provided, however, that upon the receipt of proper 16 17 proofs of the death of such a member there shall be paid to his beneficiary an amount equal to 3/16 of the compensation upon which 18 contributions by the member to the annuity savings fund were 19 based in the last year of creditable service. 20

The board of trustees shall retire him at the time specified or at such other time within 1 month after the date so specified as the board finds advisable.

1 2. This act shall take effect January 1, 1974.

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

STATEMENT

This bill amends the "early retirement" provisions of the Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund. Presently, a teacher who has completed 25 years of service may retire prior to the "normal retirement" age of 60, subject however to a reduction in his pension computed at the rate of 1/4 of 1% per month (3% annually) for each month he lacks of being 60 years of age. Under the provisions of this bill, members of T. P. A. F. who are 55 years of age or more and have completed 25 years of service would incur no reduction in pension benefits upon retirement prior to age 60. Teachers with 25 years' service retiring prior to age 55 would incur a reduction in benefits based upon 1/4 of 1% per month (3% annually) for each month they lack of age 55.
