ADOPTED APRIL 29, 1974

AN ACT concerning annual salaries and salary ranges in the Executive Branch and revising and repealing parts of the statutory law.

1 BE IT ENACTED *by the Senate and General Assembly of the State*
2 *of New Jersey:*

1 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Annual Appropriations
2 Act for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1975, the annual salaries

6 15, 1976, which is the beginning of a biweekly pay period.

STATEMENT

This bill increases the salaries of various members of the Executive Branch in three steps, consistent with the Federal Cost of Living Council's ruling of January 17, 1974 that the increase in salary provided the Governor by P. L. 1973, c. 357 (C. 52:14-15.104c) be spread over 3 years. The bill also removes salary ranges for subcabinet positions from statute, thereby permitting greater parity among such positions and other positions in State Government. The Civil Service Commission and the Department of the Treasury will establish appropriate salary ranges for these subcabinet positions through normal administrative processes.

1 4. R. S. 48:2-5 is amended to read as follows:

2 48:2-5. The members of the board shall *each* receive *such com-*
3 *pen- sation as shall be provided by law* [annual salaries as follows:
4 President, \$40,000.00; each commissioner, \$38,000.00].

1 5. The President of the Civil Service Commission, the State
2 Treasurer and the Director of the Division of Budget and Account-

STATEMENT

Senate Bill No. 895 increases in three steps the salaries of various members of the executive branch.

The Division of Budget and Accounting estimates that enactment of this legislation would require an additional State expenditure of \$128,005.00 in fiscal 1974-75, \$182,044.00 in fiscal 1975-76 and \$216,919.00 in fiscal 1976-77.

The fiscal note is based on actual cost information.
