# STATE OF NEW JERSEY

### PRE-FILED FOR INTRODUCTION IN THE 1974 SESSION

By Assemblyman OWENS

An Act concerning property exempt from attachment and amending N. J. S. 2A:26-4.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State
- 2 of New Jersey:
- 1 1. N. J. S. 2A:26-4 is amended to read as follows:
- 2 2A:26-4. Household goods and furniture not exceeding [\$500.00]
- 3 \$1,000.00 in value of a person having a family residing in this
- 4 State shall be exempt from attachment, except for a debt incurred
- 5 in the purchase thereof.
- 6 If the attaching officer believes that the goods and furniture ex-
- 7 ceed such value, he may attach and include them in his inventory and
- 8 appraisement, and the person entitled to the exemption, [or] his
- 9 family or his estate shall forthwith, on demand by the officer, select,
- 10 from the inventoried and appraised property, goods and furniture
- 11 to the value of [\$500.00] \$1,000.00. A failure to make the selection
- 12 shall be deemed to be a waiver of the exemption.
- 1 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
